

**JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS**

NEW YORK -- W. Averell Harriman, former chief American negotiator at the Paris peace talks on Vietnam, will receive the American Liberties Medallion as a highlight of the 63rd Annual Dinner of The American Jewish Committee on May 15, at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel, New York.

NEW YORK (LNS) - More than one thousand women will attend the fourteenth annual convention of Nshel Ubnos Chabad, the Lubavitch Women's Organization, to be held in New York on the weekend of May 16 - 18.

NEW YORK -- In response to the growing interest in the community, the American Zionist Youth Foundation, 515 Park Ave., N.Y.C. 10022, has decided to broaden its Summer In Kibbutz program and to arrange this summer for participation of high school students ages 16-18, in addition to the 18-25 year olds who have qualified till now.

NEW YORK: -- Mrs. Maurice Ritz, president of the Jewish Community Center of Milwaukee, has been named chairman of the newly-created JWB Manpower Commission, it was announced her by Louis Stern, president of the National Jewish Welfare Board (JWB). Mr. Stern also announced that Arthur Brody, of West Orange, N. J., a member of the board of the Essex County (N.J.) YMYWHA, has been appointed co-chairman of the Commission.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel, which began TV broadcasts in 1968, now has 100,000 TV sets in use, four times the total of a year ago.

TOYKO (WNS) -- Japan imports from Israel during 1968 totaled \$24.2 million while exports to the Jewish State amounted to \$12.5 millions.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Seventy-five major Jewish organizations and agencies are sponsoring a Salute to Israel Parade in New York on June 1.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Egypt has informed the United Nations that the Suez Canal was not the cease-fire line envisioned by the Security Council in its resolution halting hostilities between Israel and the Arab states. Cairo said the line should be east of the canal along positions held by Egyptian troops when the June 1967 resolution was adopted and from which its soldiers were subsequently driven by Israel forces acting in violation of the cease-fire.

PHILADELPHIA (WNS) -- Dropsie College for Hebrew and Cognate Learning aid research and make its collection more accessible to scholars.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israeli Deputy Prime Minister Yigal Alon has joined the Patrons Committee for the eighth World Maccabiah Games to be held in Tel Aviv July 28 - Aug. 7.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A survey of the Israeli press for 1967 conducted by Keren Hayesod revealed that there were more than 428 newspapers and periodicals published in Israel, 321 in Hebrew, 50 in English and 57 in other languages.

NEW YORK -- Edward D. Moldover, New York attorney and civic leader, was elected President of the New York chapter of the American Jewish Committee.

NEW YORK -- Fifteen scholarships for study in Israel this summer will be awarded to black Jewish students by Hatzzaad Harishon It was announced by the organizations director, Yaacov Gladstone.

NEW YORK: - a 14-day Seminar and Tour in Israel from June 3 to 17 designed especially for Jewish leadership in the American communities has been organized by the American Zionist Council, 515 Park Ave., N.Y.C. 10022.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A 14-year old youth born in the United States but living in Israel since the age of four won the International Bible championship. Runner ups to Zohar Noam were Shmuel Koenig, Yoram Reich and Gila Rotzendorfer, all of the U. S. Each won a year's scholarship for study in Israel. The World Jewish Congress, the Jewish Agency, the Jewish National Fund and the Israeli Army are joint sponsors of the annual contest.

MONTREAL (WNS) -- Irving Layton, a leading Canadian Jewish poet, said political and cultural changes in the Province of Quebec have forced him to leave Montreal, which has been the milieu of most of his work, for Toronto.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The National Conference of Jewish Communal Service will hold its 71st annual meeting in New York May 29-June 1.

**EGYPT FIRING**

Mr. Thant's warning was rather an attempt to have both sides halt further artillery exchanges and removal of observers was the only weapon that the UN has to use against Israel and Egypt. It was noted that Mr. Thant's removal of UN personnel just before the Six-Day War was a controversial move that has been cited as contributing to the war.

Israeli efforts to discourage Egyptian artillery attacks by its raid against poer installations and a dam along the Nile River were viewed as unsuccessful. The very next day an exchange of fire resulted in the death of six Israelis and President Gamal Abdel Nasser pledged in a May Day speech to continue to hit Israeli forces along the canal and to also retaliate against civilian targets inside Israel if

further raids occur. "What we have to bear in mind is that our planes also can reach Israel," he declared.

(In Israel, the limited success of the raid in terms of the minor damage done to a dam and power installations in the raid 150 miles inside Egypt. They said that foreign newsmen had been taken to a power transformer 15 miles away from the site attacked by Israel.)

(Israel was believed to have used helicopters to transport its commandos to the attack site, a tactic used in an earlier raid in October. All Israeli forces returned home without any casualties.)

Israel told Mr. Thant that its forces would make every attempt to provide for the safety of UN personnel.
