If you believe, as I do, that --

Israel has accomplished wonderful things in spite of excessive hardships --

Israel still has overwhelming problems to overcome, psychologically, economically and psycially --

There will be at least forty thousand Jewish refugees welcomed into the land during 1969, and that the problem of immigrant absorption is a constant thing --

These refugees must be taught the language and then placed in positions where they can do the most good for themselves and the country --

Thousands of apartments and homes are needed and the housing problem is significant and vital --

The aged and the sick must be cared for at any cost; and those who cannot work must be supported by the government--

The cost of maintaining a defense army is staggering and a great strain on the economy of the country --

The emphasis placed on

educational programs and projects will lead to a greater and brighter future-- and industrial life of Israel must be kept flourishing--

Traditionally, each of us is responsible for the welfare of his brother--

Russia continues to pour new and more sophisticated arms into Egypt at no cost whatever, while Israel struggles to get commitments and must pay cash-- The battle in the Middle East is one of survival or total annihilation for the Jewish people--

Israel, as the only democratic country and free society in the entire Middle

More than a year and a half after the Six Day War, Israel remains a nation at war. It is a war being waged by neighbors who refuse to make peace, and who constantly violate the cease-fire agreement by infiltration, sabotage, shellings and other war-like acts.

Whether it is a brief mortar attack on an isolated border kibbutz, a grenade thrown into the entrance of a place of worship, a bomb planted in a crowded theater, bus terminal or public street, or even an all-out artillery barrage along one of Israel's lines of defense-- the cost of this continuous fighting remains high in lives and money.

The graves of the hundreds of men, women and children killed since the Six Day War -- and the hospitals busy rehabilitating the wounded -- attest to the cost in human suffering.

The tiny bunkers crammed into the gas-proof bombshelters where kibbutz children sleep every night; the lines of tension on faces too young

to shave doing guard duty along Israel's borders -- all attest to the cost in emotional strain.

These are costs in human terms that the people of Israel are willing and some-

In a recent issue you printed on the front page a letter by a woman who converted to Judaism and who decries her plight as one who is not fully accepted by the Jewish people.

I do not question this writer's sincerity in converting to the Hebrew faith. From her tortured letter, obviously she is sincere, and bemoans the fact that the Jewish people somehow do not bring a personal answer to her predicament; needless to say, I am not a spokesman for all Jews, but I do believe a great majority will go along with what I say.

In the first place, no matter how true she might be to her new religion, she can never negate the fact that her children will be confronted with mixed families. The child-

ISRAEL MUST DEAL DIRECT

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Golda Meir has reasserted Israel's insistence on direct negotiations with the Arabs as the only path to peace in the Middle East and listed what Jerusalem thinks a peace treaty must include.

Opening the summer session of the sixth Knesset (Parliament) Mrs. Meir scored the "maneuvers" of outside parties which advance all sorts of schemes but did not demand that the Arab rulers "make peace with Israel, peace pure and simple... such as exists between most nations of the

world." She said a peace treaty must be signed document
