

**JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS**

**LOS ANGELES:** - Post #66, the Mother Post in the west of the Jewish War Veterans of the U.S.A. will celebrate its 35th Anniversary Sunday night, May 25, 1969 with a gala dinner dance at Congregation Beth Israel, Los Angeles, California. The current Commander is William Klugman, a Past National Executive Committee member and Regional Commander.

**NEW YORK:** - Philip E. Hoffman, attorney and Chairman of the Executive Committee of U. S. Realty and Investment Co. of Newark, N. J., was elected President of the American Jewish Committee, succeeding Arthur J. Goldberg, former SUPREME Court Justice and U. S. Ambassador at United Nations. Max M. Fisher, of Detroit, newly-appointed by President Nixon as consultant to the Cabinet committee that will establish priority areas for national volunteer work, was reelected Chairman of the executive Board. David Sher, New York attorney, was named Chairman of the Board of Governors. Elmer L. Winter, of Milwaukee, President of Manpower, Inc., was elected Chairman of the Board of Trustees.

**NEW YORK:** - Bertram H. Gold, Executive Vice President of the American Jewish Committee, today strongly urged intensified efforts to bring social and economic equality for all as the best means of counteracting what he termed "the negativism of confrontation."

**NEW YORK:** - The American Jewish Congress today called on West German Chancellor Kurt Kiesinger to reject pressures by "neo-Nazi and other Right Wing elements" aimed at watering down a Cabinet decision to press for abolition of the statute of limitations on genocide and murder.

**JERUSALEM:** - Dr. Norman Greenwald, President of The American College in Jerusalem, announced the appointment of Rabbi Leonard J. Goldstein of New London, Connecticut, as the first Dean of Administration of the College.

**NEW YORK:** - Two youngsters from the Greater New York area, and a Canadian, were winners in the tenth National Bible Contest held here under the auspices of the Department of Education and Culture of the Jewish Agency for Israel and the World Jewish Bible Society. One hundred and twenty teenagers from 73 communities through the United States and Canada participated.

**NEW YORK:** - A new arrangement worked out between the U. S. Department of Agriculture and its counterpart in Israel on the method of importing the Etrog (citrus) from the Holy Land for Succoth 1969 was lauded as a "model example of international goodwill to amicably resolve a religious problem." This statement was made in a letter by Rabbi Moshe Shere, executive president of Agudath Israel of America, to Dr. Ned D. Bayley, director of Science and Education at the Agriculture Department, whose Plant Quarantine Division had agreed to accept the inspection certification of the Israeli Ministry of Agriculture as a guarantee that the Etrog exported to the U. S. is free of the Mediterranean fruit fly.

**NEW YORK:** - Morris B. Abram, President of Brandeis University, asserted that America must not allow its civil and political system to be "mutilated or eradicated" by disrupting students or others in order to implement economic and social rights.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- Israel's Sephardic Jewish community has dedicated the site of the new Porat Yosef yeshiva in East Jerusalem amid the rubble of the old building that was destroyed by the Jordanian Army in 1948.

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** -- Thirty nations have already entered the Eighth World Maccabiah Games to be held in Israel July 28 - Aug. 7.

**HEBRON (WNS)** -- A group of settlers re-established the Jewish community in Hebron when they moved into permanent housing 13 months after coming to the West Bank Arab town.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- The Jewish Agency reported that its cash income from the United Jewish Appeal and Keren Hayesod was \$163.5 million for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1969.

**RIO DE JANEIRO (WNS)** -- Brazil's oldest Yiddish newspaper, the weekly Yiddish Presse, marked its 40th anniversary by publishing a special 24-page edition.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- The Hebrew University Senate elected Prof. Jacob Katz, who teaches social and educational history and leans toward Orthodoxy, as rector of the school.

**L. A. MEMORIAL DAY SERVICES**

Three memorial services will be held for Jewish veterans Friday, May 30, 1969 in Los Angeles by the Posts in the area. The Los Angeles District Council will hold its traditional program at the Hillside Memorial Park. Hyman H. Haves Regional Executive Director, and a World War II combat navigator and acting Jewish chaplain in the South Pacific, will deliver the address of the morning. Col. Joseph Solomonow, Chairman of the JWV Service Commission, will conduct the ritual service. The Weiss Post #396 Honor Guard and Drum and Bugle Corp will participate under the direction of David Weiss.

The Edwin D. Klein Post #138 in Encino will conduct memorial services at the grave of the late Ed Klein in Eden Memorial Park and hold services for all the war dead in the chapel. Ed Klein for more than 20 years was the JWV Service Officer in the Los Angeles area. Speaker will be Commander F. Mendenhall, U. S. Navy (Ret.) and Publisher of The Van Nuys News. Ted Sherwood is Post Commander.

Beth Olam Cemetery will have Post #113, under the Command of Mrs. Joseph (Miriam) Ross, conduct its annual tribute to its fallen members and to the memory of those who fought for America's survival.

Friday night, May 30, Temple Beth El of Hollywood will hold a special memorial service with Past National JWV Chaplain, Rabbi Sam Sherman officiating. Hyman H. Haves will deliver the guest sermon.

Sidney Jelin, Past Com-

mander of the David Allen-Culver City Post #667 and present DAL to the National Executive Committee, is the over - all Memorial Day Chairman for the Department and co-ordinating the local programs.

**UN 30 MILES OUT**

**UNITED NATIONS (WNS)** -- The United Nations has moved its Suez Canal observers on the Israel-held east bank to a new control center 30 miles away from the waterway and planned to relocate its center on the Egyptian side deeper inside Egypt. Egyptian gun fire had completely demolished the old center at Qantara and had caused UN personnel to give up two observation posts along the narrow embankment north of the city. Israeli shelling was cited as the reason for the relocation of the center at Ismailia to a new position further away from the canal.
