SENS. CANNON AND KENNEDY AID MIGRANT VOTERS

WASHINGTON -- Nevada Sen. Howard W. Cannon and Massachusetts Sen. Edward M. Kennedy today teamed up to introduce the Voting Rights Amendments of 1969, to enable citizens who change their residence to vote in presidential elections.

Co-sponsoring the bill are Nevada Sen. Alan Bible and 24 other senators.

"The choosing of a President is a privilege which ought to be enjoyed by every American," Cannon told his colleagues on the Senate floor.

Last year from two to five million persons were prevented from voting by residence requirements. Although some states have enacted special legislation to

reduce the residence period for presidential elections, a "significant number" continue to impose long residence requirements.

Cannon cited a 1963 report by the Commission on Registration and Voting

which reported annual changes of residence by more than 20 million adults.

"Mobility of citizens in this country is a sign of the times and our laws should keep pace with progress," he observed.

The Nevada senator pointed out to his colleagues that wherever a citizen moves, "his choices remain the same in presidential elections and national issues do not change."
