## JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK, -- A telegram strongly opposing the tentative agreement to reserve fifty per cent of eacy year's freshman enrollment at City College for student from the City's poverty areas was sent to Mayor Lindsay and all mayoral candidates by the New York chapter of the American Jewish Committee.

NEW YORK -- A record breaking number of American Jews will leave for Israel next month on summer workstudey and all year-round programs conducted under the auspices of the Jewish Agency for Israel. Of a total number of 3,339 participatnts in 47 Jewish Agency projects in Israel, according to figures released by Isadore Hamlin, executive director of the American Section of the Jewish Agency for Israel, the great majority, 2,997, wil be high school and college students. There will also be 342 adults, mainly teachers and communal workers. A minimum of another 1,500 youthful Americans will be in Israel this summer on programs sponsored by other major American Jewish organizations, and American and Israel educational institutions.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel will employ more Gaza Strip workers during 1969, including 1,000 skilled building workers, Minister of Labor Yosef Almogi reported to the Knesset,

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Cornerstone laying ceremonies were held for a new yeshiva being sponsored by Bnei Akiva, the youth movement of the National Religous Party, in the Old City overlooking the Western Wall.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Groundbreaking ceremonies were held in Tel Aviv for the Shaar Haarayot Synagogue (Lions Gate) which is being built in memory of the 600 paratroopers who have been killed since such units were established.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Military observers noted that the downing of a MIG -21 by an American-made Hawk missile fired by an Israeli crew along the Suez Canal probably was the first successful use of the weapon in combat.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The Jewish Theological Seminary of America (Conservative) is sponsoring a non-sectarian Institute for Advanced Studies in the Humanities and expects to begin classes in September with 300 undergraduate and 150 graduate students, most of them now registered in other Seminary schools,

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Bernard Katzen, a consultant on Jewish affairs to the Republican National Committee, has assured members of the Knesset that President Richard M. Nixon will completely carry out his basic promise to help Israel.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The Union of American Hebrew Congregations (Reform) has established "an emergency task force of Reform Judaism" to determine how Reform Judaism can be "more meaningfully involved and more effectively active in the urban crisis of our country."

weight of conqust.

\* The aim of the powers is a just and lasting Middle East peace, not merely a new armistice between Israel and the Arabs.

The latter two points lead directly to the basic problem facing the Big Four:

\* What borders should Israeli forces be expected to withdraw to, and

\*How should the Arab states indicate their acceptance of recognized boundaries and the end of hostilities with Israel.

The Big Four have not discussed the Palestine refugee question and passage of Israeli vessels through the Suez Canal and the Straits of Tiran. But it was noted that there is a general consensus that some refugees would be allowed to return while compensation would be given to the others and that Israel would be allowed to freely use all area waterways as to other nations.


