One aspect of the intermarriage situation which often does not get stressed is the fact that many people are turning Jewish these days.

It was a long time ago that Rabbi Max Eichhorn did a survey which indicated that some 2000 girls go Jewish each year because they want to marry Jewish husbands,

The influx now must be a much larger one, and it includes men too. In England the chief rabbinate is so deluged with requests for conversions that they have recently raised the requirements and have cracked down on "quickie" conversions outside of England, The British Orthodox authorities have even complained, believe it or not, that the Israeli rabbinate is too lenient in granting Jewishness to applicants and have said they will not automatically accept as kosher an Israeli conversion.

The popularity of Judaism is a result, of course, of the fine public image it is getting in literature and in the press. Those who come into Judaism often do so because they feel that one faith is enough for one family.

We also have some Jewish groups that are urging us to go out and recruit newcomers. But the proselytizers are not making too much headway. Most of the newcomers enter the ranks voluntarily. Classes for converts are to be found these days in every large city.

Indeed, down in New Orleans, Rabbi Leo Bergman, of Touro Synagogue, devoted a Friday night service to a "group conversion," So many of his congregants heard about the people who were turning Jewish that they asked to see the actual ceremony. So the Rabbi accomodated them, and the ceremony, often done in private, took place en masse and in public.
