The Las Vegas Hairstyling Spectacular and Barber Show, a unique new event which has attracted nationwide attention to Las Vegas, Opens Sunday for a two-day run in Hotel Sahara's Space Center convention hall.

The event builds to a climax on Monday when a \$1,000 cash jackpot and numerous trophies go on the line in competition called the Nationwide Hairstyling Championship. More than 100 stylists from all parts of the nation are expected to be cutting, clipping and styling in a race for the title.

Sponsored by Barber Local 794, the Las Vegas Spectacular affords Nevada barbers their first opportunity to send individual and team champions in Men's Hair-

styling to the USA Championship in September. In addition to trophies, winners in the Nevada State Competition will receive round-trip airline tickets to Pitts-

burgh, Pa., site of the USA Championship, to vie for top honors and the opportunity to compete in Brussels, Belgium, and Tokyo, Japan.

Leading stylists, manufacturers and competitors throughout the nation will be participating in the Las Vegas Spectacular, with technique seminars, manufacturers' exhibits and workshops for stylists and barbers featured. "This show will have national significance and is a chance for members of the industry to compare notes and techniques in a workshop atmosphere," said Joe Rando, show director. Spectators are welcome in the Space Center at nominal admission for the show and competition, to begin at 10:00 a.m., June 15.

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
