

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

BONN (WNS) -- Asher Ben Natan, Israel's Ambassador to West Germany said that left-wing students who disrupted his speech at two German universities, while not "consciously" anti-Semitic, nevertheless served anti-Semitic purposes. His talks at Frankfurt University and the University of Hamburg on Middle East peace were interrupted by Arab and left-wing students, many of the latter Jewish, each of whom were using the other groups for its own purposes.

Mr. Ben Natan said the Arab students were trying to spread anti-Jewish slogans in West Germany. The leftist students were trying to inculcate the Arab students with Marxist class conflict theories to strengthen their anti-Israel attitude. A leader of the socialist Students League contended that the demonstrators were only trying to get Mr. Ben Natan to apologize for calling the students "neo-Nazis" last year.

LONDON (WNS) -- Six British Jews are among those knighted by Queen Elizabeth on her birthday, a traditional time for such citations.

NEW YORK - Election of Georges Pompidou as President of France means that there probably will be no important immediate shift or change in French policy with regard to the Middle East and Israel, according to a post-election report received here from the European headquarters of the American Jewish Committee in Paris.

LONDON (WNS) -- The international conference of Communist Parties in Moscow said Israeli "aggression against the Arab people" has preserved "a dangerous seat of tension...in the Middle East which may start a war conflagration at any moment."

LOS ANGELES (WNS) -- The Cedars - Sinai Medical Center summer career development and medical research program will provide instruction for a record 105 students this year.

LOS ANGELES (WNS) -- The Jewish Free Loan Association, which has made more than 57,000 loans totaling \$11 million during its 64 years, is the only agency in Los Angeles which will advance funds to hard-core jobless. The association, an agency of the Jewish Federation - Council, receives requests from all kinds of poor people and loans are often the kind that help provide a means to make a living by purchasing a car or tools. Borrowers must have a means to earn a living and have a co-singer.

NEW YORK -- Rabbi Norman Lamm, Associate Rabbi of The Jewish Center, was elected Chairman of the New York Conference on Soviet Jewry at a meeting held at the Institute of Human Relations of the American Jewish Committee. The Conference coordinates the work of numerous New York-based Jewish agencies concerned with the plight of Jews in the Soviet Union, including education and public information projects.

PITTSBURGH -- The National Jewish Community Relations Advisory Council returns to the city of its birth with a 25-year record of growth and durability and a five-day agenda focused heavily on the continuing urban crisis.

NEW YORK -- The importance of developing "far more" community services for the aged so as to avoid their "almost automatic institutionalization," was emphasized during a visit by Mr. Louis Broido, Chairman of the Joint Distribution Committee, to the Jerusalem Health, Counseling and Guidance Center for the Aged. The center was established a year ago by Malben, the JDC health and welfare program in Israel.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israeli security officials are studying ways to improve security arrangements on the various roads leading to the Western Wall following the explosion of three bombs on the 16-foot wide Share el Wad (Street of the Valley) an hour after throngs of Orthodox Jews passed through on their way to Friday night services at the Wall.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The 204 delegates from the United States and 23 other countries attending the International Conference on Human Needs in Israel has adopted a resolution calling on world Jewry to raise between \$350 million and \$400 million as its share in advancing the social and economic development of Israel.

NEW YORK - Mervin H. Riseman, lawyer and civic leader, was elected President of the Jewish Community Relations Council of New York, the coordinating body of 14 national and local agencies working in the community relations field here. Mr. Riseman, Honorary President of the American Jewish Committee's New York Chapter, succeeds Arthur J. Levine, who was named an Honorary President of the JCRC at its meeting at the House of Living Judaism.

shrapnel riddled the cabin where the two girls were changing for a swim. Four taxis were set on fire.

Israeli military spokesmen said the attack on the beach 15 miles from Jerusalem and three miles south of the Abdullah bridge across the Jordan River came at the end of a barrage that had been directed against Israeli military positions five miles north of the resort.

Helicopters were used to evacuate about two dozen persons from the area which can be reached by land only over a winding and steep road. The rough roadway made it almost impossible to escape while the shelling was in progress.

Miss Anderson and Miss Bonnett were visiting Israel on their way home from the Congo where they had been teaching in Kinshasa at the American Community School for the past two years. The Christian services program of the Mennonite Brotherhood runs the school. The body of Miss Anderson was flown home. Her father is a Republican member of the Monroe County governing board.

(The Israeli Ministry of Tourism warned visitors to avoid the ceasefire lines but officials said that compliance would be left to the individual tourists. American officials called the Israeli warning sound advice that United States citizens should heed.)

Israeli jets were unopposed by Jordanian aircraft or anti-aircraft fire and all returned safely to their bases, military spokesmen said. Israel said the air raid followed a series of Arab attacks on Israeli border Patrols and settlement. Among the targets were artillery positions and guerrilla bases. The attack was not prompted by the shelling of Kellia Beach, a military spokesman said.

Amman Radio said that a variety of planes took part in the Israeli attacks and that Karameh village, which is an Arab guerrilla base, and areas around the Abdullah and Allenby bridges were hit. In other military action,

five Syrian soldiers on an intelligence mission were captured after a brief battle in the Golan Heights.

A government spokesman said that the attack at Kellia "triggered" the air strike.

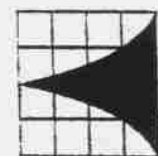
