WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Israeli Premier Golda Meir will begin a week-long visit to the United States late July or early August and will meet with President Nixon and other Administration officials.

During her stay in the U. S. Mrs. Meir will appear on television, hold a press conference and meet with American Jewish leaders.

A major topic for discussion between the Israeli leader and American officials will be the new peace plan proposed by the Soviet Union following discussions between Russia and Egypt. The plan was Moscow's response to an American proposal for ways to help end the Mideast crisis.

American officials said the Russian proposals were a "disappointment" and could even be considered a step backward in that it included suggestions that the U. S. had believed were dropped by the Soviet Union as a result of bilateral talks between the two Big Powers.

The Russian plan, which reflects the position of Egyptian President Gamal Abdel Nasser who made his

views on the U. S. proposals known to Moscow when Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko paid a hurried visit to Cairo last month, include the following points:

A detailed timetable for Israel's withdrawal from the occupied territories, Specific details for withdrawal and where troops should pull back are included for each of the areas. The U. S. plan had spoken only of a return to "secure boundaries" after such lines are agreed to by all parties. This would have taken place under a "package" agreement, a point not mentioned by the Russians. They had previously indicated they agreed with the idea of a "package" settlement.

Sharm el Sheik should be returned to United Nations control with no limitation on Egyptian activity in the area.

Establishment of demilitarized zones "astride" the frontiers. The implication is that Israel territory inside the 1967 lines would be included in these zones.

Reference to restoration of rights to Palestine refugees rather than a choice of repatriation or compensa-

After four months of intensive involvement in covering the Sirhan-Sirhan trial in Los Angeles, Las Vegas proved to be the perfect stop-off on my way back to Washington. Besides the relaxing atmosphere and fascinating shows here in 'Vegas', it was nice to meet friends and acquaintances from all over the globe, who are either vacationing in this 'wonder land', or starring in a show at one of the hotels.

At the Sands Hotel, Sir Vice President Jack Entratter greeted me with a hearty 'Shalom'. We met on Jack's first trip to Israel in 1961 -- when I was covering the Eichmann trial and Jack came to Jerusalem to open the DOROTHY ENTRATTER HOMES, named after his late wife Dorothy, (she passed away at the age of 44.)

In the last eight years, Mr. Entratter has been to Israel on four other trips. He said he'll return there next month to complete negotiations to enlarge and remodel the Entratter Homes. The complex now consists of ARNONA, an orphan home for 35 children whose ages range from two to six, and ZICHRON YOSEF, a day nursery for about 100 youngsters. Mr. Entratter will not only modernize the architecture of the homes, but will build an 'Isolation Ward' for the sick children.

Entratter, who has produced the shows for the Sands Hotel since it opened 17 years ago, introduced Danny Thomas to Sands guests in 1952. It has since been acquired by Howard Hughes. Thomas was the first star to appear on opening night at the new Landmark Hotel, which is also a Hughes Resort Hotel.

Entratter's daughter, Michele, who accompanied Jack on his initial trip to Israel, is now Mrs. Jerry Wolkoff. The Wolkoffs, together with Jack's other daughter, Caryl Palin, her husband, Michael, and Jack's five grandchildren, are now vacationing at the Sands Hotel. Both daughters and their families reside in New York.

Michele and Caryl, tennis enthusiasts, took advantage of the new tennis courts at the Sands, under the guidance of tennis pro Fred Pons. Playing tennis with the Entratter sisters were the Sands' show headliners, Eydie Gorme
