

NEW YORK--A three-day Baptist-Jewish scholars' conference sponsored jointly by the Home Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention and the Interreligious Affairs Department of the American Jewish Committee will be held August 18-20, 1969, at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky, it was announced by the conference co-chairmen, Dr. Joseph R. Estes, Secretary of the Department of Work Related to Nonevangelicals, Home Mission Board, Southern Baptist Convention, Atlanta, and Rabbi Marc H. Tanenbaum, National Director of the Interreligious Affairs Department of the American Jewish Committee, New York City.

MEXICO CITY (WNS) -- A book deemed anti-Semitic by many Jews here is being used as a text by some Mexican schools, it was reported by the Journal Sucesos Para Todos (Events for All). The book, titled America Peligra (America in Danger) was written by Salvador Borrego, a journalist.

MONTREAL (WNS) -- The Pavilion of Judaism at the Man and His World Exposition here, introduced at Expo '67, has been opened for its third season. It will be open through Sept. 7.

BONN (WNS) -- The Organization of Political Victims of Nazi Persecution has protested against plans to build a Nazi SS Museum in Wuppertal, North Rhine-Westphalia.

LONDON (WNS) -- The London Times reported from Washington that American officials are placing considerable emphasis on the U.S.-Soviet bilateral talks on the Middle East because the Four Power discussions have apparently failed, largely because of a lack of French cooperation.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Four Israeli soldiers were killed and four others wounded as a result of an attack by Egyptian commandos on an Israeli armored unit near Port Twefik, at the southernmost tip of the Suez Canal, as late bulletin reports.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel apparently intends to go ahead with the requisitioning of 300 acres of West Bank land near Kfar Etzion, south of Jerusalem. The requisition order was issued last month but was suspended by Premier Golda Meir after protests by Arabs who own some of the land.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- An Association of New York City yeshiva principals and administrators has appealed to local charitable agencies and the Jewish public at large to help alleviate "the desperate financial plight" of Orthodox Hebrew day schools in the metropolitan area.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Over 200,000 New Yorkers watched 60,000 people march in a Salute to Israel Parade on the Nation's 21st Anniversary down Fifth Avenue.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israeli writer S. Y. Agnon, 81, co-winner of the 1966 Nobel Prize for literature, was hospitalized after he collapsed in his home here. He is reported in serious condition.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- State Dept. spokesman Robert J. McClosky said that the U.S. Government deplored violations of the UN cease-fire by both Arabs and Israel.

NEW YORK (LNS) - Purchase of a new campsite in the Catskill Mts. which will accommodate more than 400 Jewish boys was announced here by Merkos L'Inyonei Chinuch, the educational arm of the Lubavitcher movement.

LONDON (WNS) -- The book, "My Testimony" smuggled out of a Russian labor camp, reported that Yuri Daniel, the Soviet-Jewish writer, was admired by his fellow inmates for the way he faced "repeated provocation by camp authorities with outstanding courage." Mr. Daniel, who was imprisoned for writing articles critical of the Soviet regime, is a special target of hostility by camp authorities, the book said, but is standing up well despite physical handicaps resulting from wounds suffered during World War II.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Israel has placed an advertisement in the Oil and Gas Journal soliciting "experienced field production engineers and foremen" for undisclosed work for the Israeli Government. "All replies held in strictest confidence," it said.
