MAJOR JET AND ARTILLERY BATTLES

ESCALATED SUEZ FIGHTING

LATE NEWS ITEMS

CAIRO: - IN A FIERY SPEECH PRESIDENT NASSER SAYS EGYPT WILL REGAIN ALL LAND LOST IN 1967. IT WILL BE A COSTLY OPERATION, IT MEANS WAR.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel and Egypt escalated fighting along the Suez Canal in a series of major battles that resulted in the downing of five Egyptian and two Israeli jets, air attacks on artillery, mortar and anti-aircraft positions along both sides of the waterway and Israeli occupation of an island at the head of the Gulf of Suez used by Cairo as an anti-aircraft and artillery fortress.

The fighting began when Israeli forces attacked and occupied for about an hour Green Island at the southern outlet of the Suez Canal below Part Taufiq. Military spokesmen said six Israeli were killed in the raid, while the attacking forces estimated the number of dead Egyptian at more than 25 with dozens of others wounded.

Anti-aircraft, artillery and other installations on the island were demolished by the Israeli forces which were subjected to artillery bombardment by Egyptian guns on the mainland while

they occupied the fortress. This shelling continued for a number of hours after Israeli troops left the island.

Radio Cairo said Egyptian forces had repulsed an Israeli attack on Green Island, turning back invading troops on the beach. It contended that 30 Israelis were killed or wounded, two landing craft with their occupants sunk and a Mirage fighter shot down while flying cover for two helicopters trying to rescue Israeli soldiers from the water.)

Military spokesmen said that the Israeli force was smaller than the 75 to 100 men estimated to be on the island. They said no Israeli planes or boats were lost but declined to say how the assault had been mounted.

The second escalation occurred Sunday afternoon while Israeli jets, for the first time, struck Egyptian artillery, mortar and anti-aircraft positions along the waterway between Port Said
