POLISH JEWS FATE UNKNOWN

GENEVA (WNS) — Officials of refugee agencies and expressing concern over the fate of the estimated 15,000 to 20,000 Jews in Poland who were told more than a year ago by the Warsaw regime to leave and then told a few months ago they cannot freely emigrate after Sept. 1.

The Netherland's mission in Warsaw, which has been handling Israeli interests, been granting visas to Israel to departing Polish Jews. The mission reported it issued about 10,000 such visas but only 5,000 Polish Jews

WASHINGTON (WNS) — The White House has announced that Israeli Premier Golda Meir will visit Washington as President Nixon's official guest Sept. 25-26. No further details were released.

(It was reported that Mrs. Meir will visit the Jewish communities in New York CITY AND Los Angeles and possibly other major cities and will meet with Jewish leaders during her stay in the United States which, sources said, was not expected to be a long one.)

Announcement of her visit came amid reports that American officials believe that there will be no major warfare in the Mideast and that Soviet leaders share this position.

Joseph Sisco, Assistant Secretary of State for Near Eastern affairs, on his return from Moscow where he met with Russian officials, relayed this conclusion to United Nations Secretary General U. Thant.

(The optimistic outlook was voiced before Egyptian President Nasser told his people that the "divertation stage" in the confrontation with Israel had begun and that "we have to fight and we shall fight for the recovery of our lands.")

(Israeli officials said that Mr. Nasser should be taken at his word and that while they do not expect any renewal of major fighting, they did not completely discount the Arabs' talking themselves into another war. They noted Cairo claims of "victories" in their commando raids across the Suez Canal and the exaggerated reports of downing of Israeli aircraft, destruction of artillery and

To Err is Human

If there is a man among us who says he never made a mistake, we asked him to please stand up.

"Sit down you liar."

We all make mistakes. Some are whoppers, others inconsequential. There are errors in judgement and errors in deed. A voter backs a flunk candidate. A driver makes a wrong turn into a one way street. Blunders are made even after careful deliberation, or spontaneously. No one is immune from mishaps. They hit us at every level of society, at all ages, in the arts, professions, politics, and ah yes, even in the religions.

Some mistakes are not considered mistakes until they are discovered later on. These are the ones most difficult to explain or erase. So the party involved either denies ever having taken part in the mishap or admits it and throws himself at the mercy of those who may judge him.

We have a vivid recollection of Pres. Nixon, as candidate for Vice President, the little dog in his arms, telling a nationwide television audience, he didn't do whatever someone accused him of doing. He asked the nation to believe him, and we did.

Then there was the senior editor of Life magazine, speaking before a packed Hollywood Bowl and over a coast-to-coast hook-up, admitting he had backed Castro and he had made a mistake.
