TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel has again attacked and damaged a section of the Ghor Canal, the most vital irrigation project in Jordan. In another attempt to force Amman to curb Arab terrorist and Jordanian army attacks on border settlements, Israeli military spokesmen said Air Force planes were sent Sunday to bomb the \$85 million canal after a step-up in Arab attacks across the cease-fire line. Almost 40 specific incidents of artillery attacks across the cease-fire line. Almost 40 specific incidents of artillery attacks, mine laying, and ambushes were detailed by Israel in the 10-day period since damages resulting from an Israeli commando raid on the waterway were repaired.

Earlier in the week, Israel had sent its planes to smash Jordanian targets that had been shelling settlements in the northern Beisan Valley. The raid on the canal was undertaken when these Arab attacks continued.

It was reported that the United States, which had financed the canal, had arranged an agreement between Jerusalem and Amman under which Israel would allow repair work while Jordan would halt guerrilla and regular Army attacks.

There was a marked reduction in Arab attacks while the canal was being repaired but shellings and other

incidents resumed at an intensified level once the waterway was reopened.

The El Fatah guerrilla command admitted for the first time in a statement that Iraqi units stationed in Jordan were participating in assaults on Israel. The Fatah announcement claimed that heavy casualties and damages were inflicted in attacks on the Yarden settlement in the Beisan Valley over the weekend and on an Israeli patrol near Hebron. Israeli military sources ridiculed the Fatah casualty claims.

In that action, it was made known that Iraqi artillery, along with Jordanian guns, provided covering fire for a group of ten marauders who crossed the Jordan River in an attempt to penetrate Yarden. Israeli intelligence reportedly learned that Iraqi forces in Jordan have formed a guerrilla unit identified as the 421st "Kadassiva" regiment.

Diplomatic observers noted that the apparent failure of the U. S. sponsored understanding may have ended the possibility of such agreements to cover other situations in the future.

Also under question was King Hussein's ability to effectively control not only the guerrillas and Iraqi troops in his nation but also his own army. An Israeli official said his nation was prepared to do this "if the

Thank you for delivering the pledge cards, and some extra copies of your fine paper, and following are the suggestions on the story appearing in your valued paper.
1. Your quotation "Among the prominent citizens sup-

4. "The first military base on the canal was set up at what is now known as Quantara". The 38th Battalion was formed, and trained in
