TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Premier Golda Meir and Defense Minister Moshe Dayan have both declared in separate statements that Israel is capable of contending with the present military situation indefinitely.

Mrs. Meir said at a luncheon of the Foreign Press Association that Israel can withstand the harrasing Arab guerrilla war because there is no other way and because the present situation is not as grave as the one that prevailed on the eve of the Six-Day War. She said Israel does not want a new war and the Arabs know that they cannot win an all-out war against Israel.

The Premier later told a political rally that Israel does not want wars even if it wins them and that she wanted to tell the Egyptian President and King Hussein of

Jordan "that if they want to try once more, we will beat them again."

Gen. Dayan told a leadership mission of the United Jewish Appeal that Israel could bear up against the pressures on all fronts for a long time to come. What worried Israel, he said, was not the presence of Soviet advisers in Egypt or the fact that they are training the Egyptians in the use of modern weapons but that the Russians are advising the Egyptians on tactics and strategy. Nevertheless, Gen. Dayan said, "we don't envy the Egyptians their mentors." Both Israeli leaders spoke during a week which saw the following military activities. Israeli jets were used last Monday to launch a heavy air attack on the heavily wooded western slopes of

"LEFT" STUDENTS WITH ARABS

JERUSALEM (WNS) --- Another Western newsman has reported that "New Left" students are training with the Arab terrorist organizations preparatory to fighting against Israel.

This report noted that about 150 students, mainly from Western countries, have formed a sort of "international brigade" and are training at secret camps in Jordan. Christian Science Monitor correspondent John K. Cooley reported from Beirut that their training is sponsored by El Fatah, the largest Palestinian commando group. "If El Fatah's normal training cycle is fol-

lowed, the volunteers should be ready for combat missions by October," Mr. Cooley wrote.

He said that the Group includes four Americans; 30 Britons, including 10 girls; 20 Irish; 20 French; 10 West Germans; and light Swedes. The remainder are from Holland, Italy, various Eastern European countries, Guyana, Guinea and India.

El Fatah spokesmen and Jordanian authorities deny the existence of the volunteers of their training camps but Mr. Cooley said he has spoken to persons directly involved with them. He ob-
