REDS KILLED

LONDON (WNS) --- A British reporter who has just returned from Cairo has written in the London Daily Express that unconfirmed reports indicate that between 10 and 35 Russian military advisers in Egypt were killed during recent Israeli air attacks near Port Said.

Donald Seaman wrote that the Soviet Embassy in Cairo has maintained quiet on alleged Russian casualties. But the reports were the first of their kind since Moscow began to re-arm Egypt after the June, 1967 war.
