was captured by Egypt as another week of war fare ended in the Middle East.

An officer and three Israeli soldiers were killed in incidents in the Suez Canal zone and the Jordan Valley over the week-end. Four Arab children were killed while playing with a live shell

The Israeli fighter-bomber was shot down by Egyptian anti-air craft fire earlier last week during a mission on Tuesday against Egyptian artillery which had been shelling Israeli positions on the canal's east bank at Al Shatt near Port Tewek. An Israeli civilian was killed in the barrage.

Israel demanded through the International Red Cross that Egypt return the Pilot Maj. Nissim Ashkenazi, 30.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israeli authorities have arrested a 27-year old Australian and charged with setting the fire that severely damaged the El Aksa mosque in Jerusalem considered by Moslems to be the third holiest shrine in Islam.

But despite the arrest of Michael Denis Rohen, a member of the Church of God fundamentalist Protestant sect a little more than 24 hours after the fire, Arab political leaders have continued to charges that Israel was responsible for the blaze and called on 500 million Moslems around the world to launch a holy war against Jerusalem.

Jerusalem was quiet but tense in the aftermath of Thursday's fire, but passions still ran high among Arabs in East Jerusalem and the occupied territories.

The Moslem religious Council in Jerusalem expressed satisfaction ver the arrest of Mr. Rohen. Israeli police stressed that the tall, blond Australian was apprehended as a result of a description given them by a Moslem gate-keeper at the mosque. But the Moslem religious leaders did not call off an Arab general strike Sunday. It brought activities to a virtual halt in the Arab quarters of Jerusalem in the Gaza Strip and the larger towns of the West Bank. But the day passed without incident except for anti-Israel demonstrations in Nablus which had to be quelled by Israeli troops.

Rohen was remanded by a Jerusalem Magistrate for 15 days. He will be brought to trial before a district court panel of judges. The trial

### IRAQIS EXECUTE 15 MORE

JERUSALEM (WNS) --- Fifteen Iraqis including two Christians and two Jews were executed in Bahdad Monday morning as alleged spies for Israel and the United States Central Intelligence Agency (C.I.A.).

According to Baghdad radio, six military men were shot by a firing squad at an Army camp outside the city while nine civilians were hanged at the central prison; fifty-one Iraqis, including 11 Jews, have now been spying since January.

Iraq began the series of execution Jan. 27 when 14 persons including nine Jews were hung on espionage

charges and their bodies displayed in public squares in Baghdad and Basra. There was no indication that any of the bodies of the persons executed today were displayed.

The executions were carried out barely a week after Baghdad radio announced that 12 Iraqis had been arrested as Israeli and U.S. spies and would face a military tribunal, the names of the 15 executed were different from the group. There was no mention of a trial by Baghdad radio which said merely that the condemned persons had been convicted

### That Shofar

When you hear the Shofar on Rosh Hashanah or Yom Kippur, ponder its significance.

True, the shofar is not sounded when Rosh Hashanah comes on the Sabbath. It is sounded, however, when the holidays are concluded.

Whether you hear it or envisage it, the shofar sounds for you.

It has a message, indeed, a number of them.

First, remember that the shofar was once used as an instrument of war. It assembled the troops to oppose the enemy. Now the military item has been converted to a moral one, summoning us not to combat against a human foe, but against a formidable enemy; the impulsive and the impetuous within us. As the shofar is sounded we are called upon to review and to revise whatever in our make-up can be improved.

Remember, too, that the jarring sound of the shofar is meant to awaken us from lethargy. Throughout the year we get jaded and insouciant. We forget our obligations to lead and live a better life. The ram's horn is like an alarm clock, urging us to arise from torpor and move towards spiritual amelioration.

Then there are those shofar calls. The long, smooth
