will be held in one of the largest halls available in order to admit as many members of the public as possible, it was learned today. Israeli police said Friday that they had enough evidence against the suspect to assure a conviction. One report said today that Rohen had confessed though his motives remain unknown.

Meanwhile, an investigation committee headed by Judge Abraham Granott, president of Israel's Supreme Court and including two Arab judges, began open hearings in Jerusalem, Israel has also invited experts and engineers from any country who could expedite repairs to the Moslem shrine to come to Jerusalem to help. Experts from Arab countries would be admitted if the Moslem Religious Council requested it, Government spokesmen said.

The fire was reported at 7:20 a.m. local time Thurs-

day and damaged the south wing of the mosque. The roof over the win collapsed leaving only charred walls. The El Aksa mosque sits atop the Western (Wailing) Wall on what is known as the Temple Mount. It stands about 100 vards from the Dome of the Rock (Mosque of Omar) where, accoding to Moslem tradition, the Prophet Mohammed ascended to heaven. It was on that site that King Abdullah, of Jordon, grandfather of King Hussein, was assassinated by Arab terrorists in 1951. After the twin shrines of Mecca and Medina, the El Aksa mosque is the holiest spot to devout Moslems.

Israeli firemen, who fought the blaze for threeand-half hours, arrived on the scene eight minutes after the alarm was sounded. But they were hampered by furious Arab mobs who pelted them with rocks and sticks and damaged a fire hydrant so that water had to be brought by tank trucks.
