UN CONDEMNS ISRAEL, AS USUAL

UNITED NATIONS (WNS)-A deadlock prevailed through the Week-end in the United Nations Security Council over disposition of the Lebanese and Israeli crosscomplaints arising out of Israel's airstrike against terrorist bases in Lebanon earlier this month. Neither Pakistan, with a resolution sharply condemning Israel, nor the United States with a resolution condemning Israel but, at the same time, condemning all other violations of the cease-fire, had succeeded in obtaining the nine votes necessary to carry the resolution in the 15member Security Council.
