6 ISRAELIS KILLED LAST WEEK

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli commandos struck deep inside Egypt and battered an Egyptian Army headquarters base last week as fighting in the Mideast claimed the lives of six Is-

raelis. The commandos, believed transported to the site by helicopters as in past raids, hit the regional headquarters at Manqabad, 200 miles south of Cairo on the Nile River, with 120 mm heavy mortars. The target, about the same distance from the Aswan High Dam, is near Asyut, the Nile River birthplace of Egyptian President Nasser.

Israeli military spokesmen said the raid was in retaliation for continued Egyptian violations of the cease-fire along the Suez Canal.

The Commandos, all of whom returned safely, said the assault caught the Egyptians by surprise even though the base and a nearby army camp was brightly lighted

SELICHOS SERVICES SAT.

Daniel Goldfarb, president of Temple Beth Shalom, 1600 E. Oakey Blvd. invites the Jewish Community of Las Vegas to attend and participate in the traditional Selichos Services, which will be held in the Main Sanctuary at 11:45 p.m. on Saturday evening, September 6, 1969.

Services will begin with a short address on the meaning of Selichos, delivered by Rabbi Aaron S. Gold, spiritual leader of the Temple. Cantor Joseph Kohn will chant the liturgy, assisted by the Temple's High Holiday Choir under the direction of Cantor Herman Kinnory. A breakfast-refreshment period, hosted by the Temple Sisterhood, will take place in the Social Hall, immediately after the conclusion of the services.

Selichos, the only midnight service in Judaism, ushers in the Jewish High Holiday Season. Rosh Hashono, the Jewish New Year, begins on Friday evening, Sept. 12 and continues for 2 days on Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 13 and 14. Kol Nidre night will occur on Sunday evening, Sept. 21, and Yom Kippur Day is Monday, Sept. 22nd.

Abraham & God

Every New Year, the Synagogue becomes a hall of confession. Everybody brings his inner stories and conflicts. These are set off in prayer as the age-old drama of Abraham and Isaac versus God is re-enacted. Those who know the mythic tale re-live it; for those new to the legend, it is an absorbing story of a father who was prepared to sacrifice his son for God. No greater love to make such a sacrifice. That God is said to have sent an Angel emissary to prevent the action is supposed to indicate that some sacrifices which humans are ready to make are senseless. It somehow does not sufficiently explain His earlier role in the request simply to test Abraham's loyalty. But Sacrifice could be a theme of the New Year.

The dictionary offers several meanings for the word and one of the most interesting is: to make sacred. It is holy to give up something of value, not as an atonement, but to achieve a better end. God's demand on Abraham
