## JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK -- Hostile Arab propaganda, the challenge of the New Left, and the attitude of the Jewish intellectuals will be thoroughly discussed at the annual seminar for campus representatives of the University Service Department of the American Zionist Youth Foundation which will take place in Hightstown, New Jersey, September 5 through 7, 1969.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The United Synagogues of America (Conservative) has endorsed the idea of sending non-political High Holy Day greeting cards to synagogues in the Soviet Union as a symbol of good-will between American and Russian Jewry. The Jewish Council of Washington, D. C., has compiled a list of Soviet Cities that have synagogues.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The Israeli Army weekly publication Bamachneh has disclosed that Russian-built troop-carriers captured during the Six-Day War are being used by Israel.

NEW DELHI (WNS) -- Indian Foreign Minister Dinesh Singh has declared that Israel must be held responsible for the El Aksa mosque fire and called for United Nations action to enforce a Security Council resolution barring Israeli annexation of Arab East Jerusalem.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Fifty American manufacturers will display equipment in various consumer and commercial fields at a special United Nations trade show at the Tel Aviv Fair Grounds Oct. 5-10.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Keren Hayesod, the Fund-raising arm of the world Zionist movement used to support Jewish Agency relief and rehabilitation activities in Israel, will raise \$70 million from Jews outside the United States this year, according to Dr. Israel Goldstein, world Chairman of the organizatio.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Israel has denounced the Security Council's condemation of its air attack on Arab guerrilla bases in Lebanon as another case of the United Nations' "double standard" under which Jerusalem's reprisals raids are deplored while terrorist provocation are ignored.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israeli Foreign Minister Abba Eban will accompany Premier Golda Meir on her visit to the United States Sept. 24-25. Mrs. Meir, will meet with President Richard M. Nixon at the White House and will stay at Blair House where the President's guests are accomodated. Mr. Eban will attend the opening of the fall session of the United Nations General Assembly and is expected to address the body on the second or third day.

LONDAON (WNS) -- Scotland Yard has drawn up plans to prevent a "holy war" between Arabs and Israelis in England following bombings at the Zim Lines office and the home of a Jewish couple in London.

TEL AVIV (WNS) The Jewish National Fundhas stepped -up reclamation efforts on the Golan Heights and has begun preparing 25,000 more acres for agriculture in addition to the 12,500 acres already rehabilitated and turned over to settlements on the occupied Syrian territory.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israeli security officers reported that an unsuccessful attempt was made to kill Deputy Premier Yigal Allon in a Jerusalem suburb when he was scheduled to address an Israeli Labor Party election rally.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The National Jewish Commission on Law and Pulic Affairs is negotiating with the United States Civil Service Commission for the promulgation of rules requiring all federal agencies to accomodate the religious needs of Sabbath observers.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Election officials reported that 1,850,000 Israelis out of a total population of over 2,5



million have registered to vote in the Oct. 29 elections.

BUENOS AIRES (WNS) -- A new form of anti-Semitism, originating from the cooperation between the Left, Arab forces and the extreme Right, poses a threat to Argentine Jewry, according to the general secretary of DAIA, the representative organization of Argentine Jewry.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israell chemists working for Alliance Caesarea Pylymer Industries have developed a new type of polurenthane plastic to remove petroleum contaminates from the surface of rivers, lakes and the open sea.

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- B'nai B'rith Women, shocked and alarmed by the latest executions in Iraq of 12 alleged spies -- two of them Jews -- has called on the United States and the United Nations to excet pressure on the Iraqi government that would effectively halt any further executions.
