THE GREAT MAN OF THE PHILIPINE ISLANDS

Ordinarily when one returns from a trip abroad, the subject of his remarks concerning his travels would center around the sights and cultures he had just visited. However, during my tour of the far east, I was most impressed by a man that I met on the Isle of Luzon, in the Philipine Islands - Dan Aguinaldo. His name itself is not important, at least not to

The salient aspect of this man is that he had humble origins before attaining the heights which he has now ascended. He was born of a family of merchants in Manila, on the Isle of Luzon, growing to maturity he became unsatisfied with the prospect of being merely a merchant's son and eventual successor to the family business, so at the end World War II he struck out on his

Showing imagination and tenacity he obtained a concession to various timber lands on the island of Men-

denau. The logging business was hampered due to the extreme swampy conditions of the roads in the monsoon The concession seemed doomed to failure when Aguinaldo met and befriended a retired engineer from the United States who gave him the idea of building a cord wood road with some of his own timber. This road is similar to the type of road used in the United States in the 18th and 19th centuries.

Throughout the years Mr. Aguinaldo was faced with enumerable problems in making his logging enterprise a going concern, but was able overcome many drawbacks and established, what is now a successful and extremely profitable business.

He employs 700 people in this venture, which is not

his only business, but laid the ground work for his other fabulous successes.

Today chicken raising is another example of his many concerns. By cross-breeding chickens from the United States with his own stock, he developed an extremely hardy breed of chickens for 250 hectares, (750 acres) the Philipines. Mr. Aguinaldo now speeds day old chicks to Manila in one of his own planes at the rate of 70,-000 per month. This endeavor not only has proven commands his own private profitable for Mr. Aguinaldo. but is an extreme boon for , chasers, 5 motor launches, the people in the Philipines, and 3 speed boats. due to the fact that he employs many people in this operatin, and now provides an abundant supply of fowl to his people, which at one time was a scarcity.

Chickens are not the only livestock that Mr. Aguinaldo is now producing. Hogs and quail have proven to be very profitable in his farming concern. Interestingly enough, Mr. Aguinaldo supplys many Chinese restaurants throughout the far east with the Chinese delicacy of quil eggs. In this connection he has brought Japanese technicians to help him gain the most from this quail egg production. Mr. Aguinaldo' appreciation for scientific methods is characteristic by his also bringing to the Philipines an American food scientist, who is attempting to develop new foods produced from papaya and other

abundent and prolific plants an extremely sophisticated that are indiginous to the islands.

Mr. Aguinaldo has left no stone unturned in his endeavor to create new commercial enterprises. He raises cultured pearls.

His land holdings spand and he employs a total of 3,000 people. Mr. Aguinaldo maintains over 150 vehicles in all phases of his operation and also maintains and navy, which includes 2 sub-

Personally Mr. Aguinaldo is an optimistic and friendly person. His face bears the mature strain of a man in deep thought and of far reaching plans and ambitions. He is truly a man of destiny.

His plans for commercial development are not without giants. their altruistic roots, He has

plan for raising the educational and cultural level of the people of the Phili-pines. This is one of his most noted features, the care and appreciation he shows to his employees. Each year he holds a feast in honor of his employees, which lasts for several days.

He initiated and now maintains a sophisticated urban housing development for his employees which is uncharacteristic of employers in this part of the world.

His devotion to the people of the Philipines is Lincolnlike, which is probably one of the reasons for his suc-

He has achieved the respect, love and admiration of his employees.
