ROME (WNS) -- Italian that the new Libyan regime has declared it will follow an independent course in the Arab world and will treat the Jewish citizens on an equal basis with all other citizens.

## LIBYA RECOGNIZES JEWS

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Is- questioning. raeli jets continued to roam freely through the skies of the Middle East as they carried our almost daily attacks on Arab forces arrayed along the Egyptian and Jordanian fronts.

While regular Arab army forces remained inactive, guerrilla groups continued their terrorism and killed an Israeli woman and injured 17 Arabs and Jews in a handgranade attack in the Gaza marketplace. A number of suspects were detained for

Israeli jets have been returning on an almost daily basis to the Egyptian gulf of Suez coastline where ground forces carried out a 10-hour assault earlier this month. The planes have been used to hit guerrilla groups which have been shelling border settlements and ambushing patrols.

Military spokesmen reported that no Israeli jets have been lost in these raids. The only air casualty was one (Continued on Page 2)
