ISRAEL ASKS NEWS OF 2 PILOTS

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel has warned that it might take "certain actions" if

Cairo continues to hold two downed pilots incommunicado and speculation in Tel Aviv centers on another Israeli assault on Egypt with the aim of capturing some high ranking military personnel.

The pilots were shot down recently, one during a series of air attacks which were coordinated with Israel's 10-hour ground assault on Egypt's Gulf of Suez coast and the other during aerial fighting sometime before the land raid. Cairo radio reported both pilots were injured but so far has refused

Michael Ravid, Consul General of Israel in the Western area of the United States, based in Los Angeles, is coming to Las Vegas to bestow his country's honors on Justice David Zenoff, at a banquet on Sunday evening, October 12th, at 6:30 p.m., at Caesar's Palace.

The Israeli statesman will be the guest of the Las Vegas Israel Bond Committee, with Hank Greenspun as Chairman and Howard P. James as Dinner Chairman. The featured speaker at the banquet will be the internationally famous Bishop C. Edward Crowther, Fellow at the Center for Democratic Institutions.

Consul General Michael Ravid was born in Russia and immigrated to Danzig, Poland at an early age. He finished secondary schooling there and then took his degree in Agricultural Engineering at the University of Algiers. After completing his education, he was called to Germany and worked with the underground to help organize displaced Jews for settlement in then-Palestine, following the rise of Hitlerism.

Mr. Ravid settled in the Holy Land, in 1935, and joined the Kibbutz (communal farm settlement) way of life. He belonged to the Hagana and participated in its activities on behalf of the "illegal immigration" into Palestine. In 1962 Mr. Ravid joined the Israel Ministry for Foreign Affairs and was appointed Ambassador to Guinea, a post he held until 1964. He was named to his present position as Consul General of Israel in December 1967.

Israel Must Survive

You would think nothing could be added to what an informed Jew already knows about circumstances in Israel and the Middle East.

But along comes Gen. Matityahu Peled, a hero of Israel's Six Day War, to tell of everyday human reactions by the man in the street, the all-over Arabic political plan, the Russian influence and Israel's five-year-policy to keep up with current developments.

Gen. Peled made his observations to a select group of elite Las Vegas, who pledged more than \$500,000 for Israel Bonds. The campaign is pegged at one million, between now and the Israel Tribute Dinner on Oct. 12 at Caesars Palace.

The informed general, who commanded the Nifratz Shlomo Castle in the Sinai campaign of 1956, told us of the Arab plan to kill 10,000 Jews. He said this number was considered by them sufficient to bring Israel to its knees. Between the Six Day War and the present, 500 Israelis have been killed, half being civilians.

His discourse on the relative armed strength of Israel and the Arabs was revealing. Since the Six Day War he stated, even when the last of the 50 jets from the U.S. are delivered late in 1970, with the accelerated pace of modern weaponry, Israel is barely keeping in status quo since the end of the Six Day War. On the other hand, the

'QUEEN OF ISRAEL' WELCOMED AT WHITE HOUSE

The last time a Middle East "queen" caused such a stir was when Cleopatra came down the Nile. This was the feeling and the reaction in the nation's capital last week when Israel's Prime Minister Golda Meir came here on a state visit.

Mrs. Meir impressed President Nixon with her fortitude and dynamism, captured this city's most sophisticated audience -- the National Press Club -- with her resoluteness and directness, and charmed the Washington and Baltimore Jewish communities with her friendliness and humbleness.

For some brief moments it was almost possible to forget the tension in the Mideast -- so warm and 'heimishe' was the reception and so colorful and splendid was the atmosphere surrounding her arrival ceremonies.

The 71-year-old Mrs. Meir, who is a mother of two and a grandmother to five, was greeted at the South Lawn of the White House by President and Mrs. Nixon with a hearty 'Shalom' and presented with a bouquet of red roses. There was a bright morning haze. Three hundred privileged onlookers waved miniature Israeli and American flags as the band played both hatikvah (Israel's National Anthem) and The Star Spangled Banner. A 19-gun salute was fired

simultaneously with the music. Mrs. Meir was accorded full Armed Forces honor. Wearing a beige suit, she looked
