Jerusalem (WNS) -- The Foreign Ministry reasserted that Israel was following its usual policy toward Lebanon during the current Lebanese crisis and specifically disavowed a statement by Deputy Premier Yigal Allon implying military intervention if the Beirut regime was overthrown by pro-guerrilla elements.

Mr. Allon asserted in a speech that in his personal view the fall of the current government would under-

mine the Israeli-Lebanese cease - fire agreement and "Israel would have to take all possible measures to guarantee her security on the northern border.

The United States Department deplored Mr. Allon's statement and called it "unhelpful." Washington made clear that a U. S. intervention as was done during the Eisenhower Administration was out of the question.

The Soviet Union said the

### 4 RED TANKS

LONDON (WNS) -- The London Daily Express has reported that Israel captured four Russian T-62 medium tanks, the backbone of Soviet armored forces, in its raid on Egyptian positions along the Gulf of Suez and sent them to Great Britain for study tests. British and Israeli defense officials have denied the report but the newspaper's defense correspondent said "an official denial was inevitable because of the diplomatic implications."

The tests match the Russian tank with its powerful 115-mm. guns against the modern British Chieftain tanks which Israel is seeking to buy. Israel has no gun to match the Russian's.

TEL AVIV (WNS) ----- Seven Israelis -- three civilians and four military personnel -- were killed last week as Arab terrorists and regular forces struck deep inside Israel and the Israeli-administered occupied territory.

Israel also reported downing two Egyptian jets during a series of Arab air raid over the Sinai Peninsula. Two Israelis died of wounds received during one of the five raids that Egyptian planes made in two days. Cairo radio claimed shooting down two Israeli jets, a charge denied by Tel Aviv.

The two civilians -- a 50-year-old mother of three and a 55-year-old man--were killed in separate incidents as Arab terrorists set off five bombs in a 24-hour period in Haifa. The time bombs, believed by security officials to have been set by the same group, went off under apartment houses in different parts of Haifa. Sixteen persons were injured in the explosions which went off on the ground or under the buildings, many of which are partially supported by concrete pillars because of the city's hilly terrain.

Two Israeli soldiers, who died, were among 11 wounded during an Egyptian air raid on a military base at Romani on the main highway across northern Sinai, 12 miles from the Suez Canal. The brief run of one or two passes was unopposed as the Egyptian jets came in from the Mediterranean Sea and returned home the same way. The same method was used by Egypt on an attack on Nahal Yam, a para-military fishing settlement on Lake Bsrda will on the Mediterranean 50 miles east of the Suez Canal. This attack resulted in minor damages and

no Israeli casualties. The other Egyptian raids were made directly across the Canal and one downed Arab jet was hit by an American-made Hawk anti-aircraft missile in the Great Bitter Lake region. Another exploded in air. Egyptian jets carried out two daylight and one night raid in the area and the brief attacks resulted in little damage. Israeli military spokesmen said. One Israeli officer was killed and two soldiers wounded in an ambush on the West Bank near Hebro. They were on a routine pa-
