CY NEWMAN'S NEW POLICY FOR RADIO KTOO

I am Cy Newman, General Manager of Radio Station KTOO. For the pest week or so, mainly on Joe Delaney's top-rated Open Line program, we have recelved calls from regular listeners who have expressed concern at the upcoiming change in format and music that will take over on November 1. Admittedly, the number of critical calls have been small But even a very small min ority has the right to be heard. So we here at KTOO Radio have welcomed these calls.
I just mentioned the word "minority", which is what the whole change at KTOO Radio is all about. I would like to state that I person ally am not a wild-eyed militant, nor dowe have, or plan to have, any wild-eyed mill tants on our staff. I person ally abhor violence in any form from any part of our society, white or black. don't feel that anything has ever been accomplished through burning or rioting or even name-calling.
Let me tell you briefly what our plans are for KTOO Radio. KTOO Radio, in point of years, is one of the oldest radio stations in the Greater Vegas Valley. However, for what ever reason, KTOORadio over the past half-dozen years has fallen behind the pack and lost favor with both iisteners and advertisers, So, when I was hired to take over management of KTOO Radio, I saw that something had to be done quickly and dramatically. I have spent some 34 years in broadcasting. I respect broadcasting both as a business and as an integral part of any community. To change our programming here at KTOO to middle - of - the - road music, or country-western music, or rock-and-roll music, would just duplicate programming that the listeners of Greater Las Vegas

the area. But no radio station is making an all-out effort to present the problems of our minority groups. No radio station in Greater Las Vegas is attempting to come up with some solutions in depth for these problems. This is what KTOO Radio will attempt to do. And believe me, problems that affect our neighbors in West Las Vegas all affect you and me. These problemsare not their's alone. They belong to all of us. News of what is happening in West Las Vegas should be of interest to those of us who live in all of Greater Las Vegas. Because if we don't know how our neighbors live, we can never understand them fully. Not to get to the subject sour music. What is "soul" music? I don't think that anyone really knows. Except that is expresses the hopes and the fears, and the desires, and the frustration of any person, black or white. Soul music is Lou Rawls, and it is the music of Aretha Franklin. But it is also the music of Frank Sinatra, and of Joe Williams and of Pegry Lee. In short, "soul" music has it's place in our society just as country-western or from now getting very ably symphonies radio stations in fymphies or rock-and-
rol or any other type of music. I realize that the music will be playing here on KTOO Padio starting November 1 will not please everyone, and that many of you may turn for your radio entertainment to other stations in the ares. But certainly, the former music policy of KTOO Padio, that of modern jazz, didn't please everyone either. Nor did it's predecessor, country-western music, please everyone. So, we lose some old friends, and we hope to gain some new ones. Even more importan with an expended staff, we hope to serveall of the people in the Greater Las Vegas area .- those in our city of origin, Henderson, and in West Las Vegas, and in Boulder City, and in North Las Vegas as well.
When we editorialize, as we will regularly, we will present the problems, but also attempt to present possible solution. And our KTOO Microphones will al ways be open to any responsible organization or individual with a dissenting view. Getting back to the subjec of militancy we will course permit those who class themselves as mili tants to have their say here at KTOO Padio. Whether we agree or disagree with them, they have a right to be heard. And I would rather have them take time to express their own opinions here, than have them express those opinions at the end of the fire during a riot.
Those of us here at KTOO Radio are going to make an effort to bring a new vitality back to broadcasting here in Las Vegas area. Before you condemn us, or before you hope you'll give us a chance to show you what we mean. You might just like what you
