

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

LONDON (WNS) -- More than \$3.6 million was raised in 1969 so far by the Jewish National Fund of Great Britain to land reclamation projects in Israel.

LONDON (WNS) -- A Labor Zionist leader has charged that two pro-Arab Members of Parliament have been supplied between \$240,000 and \$600,000 for anti-Israel propaganda as part of an extensive effort in England.

LOS ANGELES (WNS) -- Expressions of support for Israel were voiced by three California politicians who have differed on many other issues. Gov. Ronald Reagan and Sen. George Murphy, Republicans, and Sen. Alan Cranston, Democrat, noted their backing for Israel at the Western regional conference of the Jewish National Fund. They were presented with plaques indicating that a grove of 1,000 trees had been planted in Israel in each of their names.

PARIS (WNS) -- The Rothschild Bank and L'Aurore, a French newspaper that has editorially supported Israel, were attacked by young Arabs and leftwing students supporters of El Fatah, who smashed windows and painted anti-Israel slogans on walls.

MIAMI BEACH (WNS) -- The National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods (reform) will build a synagogue as a gift to the Ben Shemen pioneer youth village south of Tel Aviv.

PITTSBURG (WNS) -- Rabbi Abraham Leifer, a Hasidic rabbi, plans to go to Israel shortly to establish a court and yeshiva in Tel Aviv made up of Hassidic families from Pittsburgh.

PARIS (WNS) -- Former Israeli Premier David Ben Gurion said he thought that Israel should return all the occupied territories to the Arabs except for East Jerusalem and the Golan Heights. Mr. Ben Gurion, who stressed he was speaking as a private citizen when in France to address a United Jewish Appeal gathering, said that peace was more important than holding on to occupied land and he included the Sharm-el-Sheikh stronghold overlooking the Straits of Tiran as among the territory to be returned.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel has begun establishing volunteer civil defense units composed of persons who have passed the age limit for both active and military duty. These forces, which have been given special police powers in some municipalities, are selected from local residents who can stop strangers and they are assigned to patrol streets and approaches to their towns.

BONN (WNSI) -- Adolf von Thadden, head of the right-wing National Democratic Party, said that the next party conference later this month would make clear that the NPD is in no way descended from Hitler's National Socialist Party either ideologically or in its membership. The NPD had predicted it would gain enough votes in last month's German elections to win Parliament seats but failed to do so.

NEW YORK -- The appointment of Dr. Isreal Margalith as director of the Youth Aliyah office in the United States and Canada, a new post, was announced by JOSEPH Klarman, head of the Youth Aliyah department, before returning to Jerusalem after having addressed the Hadassah convention in New Orleans.

NEW YORK -- Forty-eight shlichim (emissaries) of the Department of Torah Education and Culture of the Jewish Agency for Israel are now in the United States and Canada serving as consultants and teachers at yeshivas and their educational institutions. It was announced by Dr. Emanuel Rackman, member of the Executive of the Jewish Agency-American Section and chairman of the Advisory Committee of the Torah Education and Culture Department.

NEW YORK - There has been substantial progress in Jewish-Christian relations since Vatican Council II, a prominent rabbi declared, but there is "a long way to go before the professions of love, brotherhood and justice are translated into practice." Marc H. Tanenbaum, national director of the Interreligious Affairs Department of the American Jewish Committee, praised the launching of a series of seminars and public lectures on Judaism and the Jewish people at the Pius XII Religion Education Center in Detroit.

NEW YORK - Rabbi Arthur J. Lelyveld of Cleveland traced the common origin and half-century of cooperation between the American Jewish Congress and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People as he presented the 1969 Stephen S. Wise Award of the Congress to Roy Wilkins, executive director of the NAACP. Rabbi Wise, founder and longtime president of the Congress, was one of a small group that launched the NAACP in 1909.

culture, science, crafts, arts and diplomacy. The recent hostilities have resulted in a greater influx of parentless children to the Youth Aliyah program, supported by funds raised by the membership of over 300,000 Hadassah women.
