the balloting that the outpouring of Arab votes ---9,000 out of 35,000 who were eligible to vote in the municipal elections -- was a repudiation of the established leadeship in the Old City. He had waged an Americanstyle campaign that included a pool of vehicles to transport Arab voters to the polls.

The Old City Arabs ere eligible to vote only in the Jerusalem municipal election and not the national balloting. Under Jordanian rule only male property owners had the franchise, Israel extended the vote to all men and women over 18.

Observers noted that scores of Arab women and young men came out to vote and the election atmosphere was similar to the days just after the Six-Day War when the walls dividing the city were torn down and Jews and Arabs mixed in a friendly festive manner.

There was some speculation that the unexpected heavy Arab turnout marked a turning point in the city's affairs and could have an effect beyond the results of the voting. It seemed to indicate to observers that Arabs of many different backgrounds ignored the terrorist threats and the stigma of cooperating with the Israelis to take part in running the new, united city.
