ISRAEL RAIDS DEEP, CAPTURES 11

JERUSALEM: - Israeli military spokesmen disclosed that three commando raids were carried out deep behind Egyptian lines during the previous week and 11 prisoners were brought back. No Israeli losses were reported, while six Egyptian soldiers were reported killed.

The raids hit a position on the Gulf of Suez at Ras Abu Darag, another post on the coastal road between Ras Zafarana and Ras Rhareb could not be determined because of the ballots not yet counted and the proportional representation system which requires that an election list must get at least one percent of the vote to qualify for Knesset membership. and a third inland on the Safaga-Keena road linking the Nile Valley and the Gulf and Red Sea area. The patterns of the attacks indicates they were small raids, conducted with great speed and precision and directed at specific objectives.

The prisoners are expected to aid Israel in negotiating with Cairo for the release of two pilots. Previous efforts have failed and only recently have Egyptian officials allowed the Red Cross to visit one of the Israelis whom they have kept incommunicado for over a month. The Red Cross had visited the other pilot.

In other military activities, Egyptian air forces continued to show greater daring as they carried out a number of quick strikes against Israeli positions in the Suez Canal area. Israeli spokesmen said these raids involved one or two passes over their positions and have resulted in little damage.

the balloting that the outpouring of Arab votes -- 9,000 out of 35,000 who were eligible to vote in the municipal elections -- was a repudiation of the established leadership in the Old City. He had waged an American-style campaign that included a pool of vehicles to transport Arab voters to the polls.

The Old City Arabs are eligible to vote only in the Jerusalem municipal election and not the national balloting. Under Jordanian rule only male property owners had the franchise. Israel extended the vote to all men and women over 18.

Observers noted that scores of Arab women and young men came out to vote and the election atmosphere was similar to the days just after the Six-Day War when the walls dividing the city were torn down and Jews and Arabs mixed in a friendly festive manner.

There was some speculation that the unexpected heavy Arab turnout marked a turning point in the city's affairs and could have an effect beyond the results of the voting. It seemed to indicate to observers that Arabs of many different backgrounds ignored the terrorist threats and the stigma of cooperating with the Israelis to take part in running the new, united city.
