## NASSER'S SPEECH TO EGYPTIAN PARLIAMENT

JERUSALEM (WNS) ---- Israeli leaders have described President Gamal Abdel Nasser's speech to the Egyptian Parliament pledging "war and bloodshed".

To overcome Israel as further proof, if any was needed, of the Arab leaders' total ambition to destroy that nation.

Foreign Minister Abba Eban said the belligerent speech "once more reveals Nasser's true aspiration to eliminate Israel's independence and existence." Mr. Eban said the Egyptian leader's policies has brought "Constant misery and tragedy" to his nation and the speech not only "demonstrates the frustration of this sinking tyrannic regime," but also "promises further ordeal" to Egypt.

In his speech, monitored in Israel, President Nasser said Egyptian efforts leading to a peaceful solution to the Arab-Israel crisis and the recovery of occupied lands had failed and "war" and "bloodshed" are the only solution.

"There is no longer a way out of our present situation except by forging a road toward our objective violently and by force over a sea of blood and under horri-

zons blazing with fire," he told the opening session of the Parliament and the Egyptian nation over a radio and TV hookup in his first address since a recent series of illnesses.

The speech followed successful commando raids across the Suez Canal in which Egyptian forces killed three Israelis, wounded a score more and captured one. (Israeli forces retaliated with air attacks on Arab positions along the west side of the waterway.) The raids were believed carried out to lend credence to Egyptian claims that the war of attrition against Israel was taking a heavy toll of Israeli lives and materials.

Israeli officials also said that Mr. Nasser was particularly upset over a flight by one Mirage jet over Cairo in which the plane reached supersonic speed with the noise breaking glass. The jet returned safely to Israel without meeting any air opposition. Reports from Cairo indicated that anti-aircraft guns opened fire after the plane left the area.

President Nasser told the Parliament that the Government had spent 500 million Egyptian pounds to re-arm

Bilbray Tells All

What started out as an innocent, well-meaning proposal to include a statue of Jesus Christ in a Peace Memorial to stand on public land of the Convention Center, which could have been nipped in the bud at the outset, has developed into a cause celebre.

The whole country is aroused, factions are beginning to form, stories without foundation are appearing in English and Jewish newspapers, the American Jewish Congress is prepared to send a lawyer to fight construction of the statue and rash unnecessary statements are creating animosities that had never existed or had lain dormant for years. And for what? Absolutely no reason at all.

Here is the full story told to us by James A. Bilbray, General Chairman of Las Vegas Peace Memorial Committee, who proposed the statue of Christ to the Las Vegas Convention Authority. Bilbray is Clark County Assessor, and a man whose reputation for honesty and integrity is long known to the Israelite.

"It began," said Bilbray, "when quite by accident I ran into old friends, Jake and Lois Gottlieb." Gottlieb is one of the owners of the Dunes Hotel. Bilbray said that Mrs. Gottlieb, who was recovering from an illness, expressed the desire to establish a place where people of all religions could pray. "Jake," according to Bilbray, "immediately offered to underwrite the cost of a shrine, if I would help bring it about."

Bilbray continued: "I remembered a shrine I had seen in San Diego and described it to Mrs. Gottlieb, who incidentally is a Gentile. She told me to investigate it further and Jake, whose only purpose was to please his wife, said he'd go as high as \$50,000 if necessary."

Bilbray then told of organizing a committee and send-

## ARABS MAY USE GERM WARFARE

WASHINGTON (WNS) --- Some Congressmen have voiced the fear that Arab terrorist groups might use chemical and germ warfare against Israel's civilian population through such means as introducing bacteriological agents into the water supply of Israeli cities. They doubted Israeli retaliation in kind because of Jerusalem's "humanitarian principles."

The possible danger was cited after disclosure in Congress that the United States Army had given Egyptian military officers CBW training a few years ago. Egypt used poison gas in Yemen, it was noted. The Nixon Administration has not released to the Congress a complete list of all Arab officers from various nations that have received training in military specialties including CBW.

The danger of Egyptian use of poison gas against Israeli forces along the Suez Canal was discounted because Israel could retaliate with chemical warfare against Arab Military targets.
