The fluid grace of skating itself, the sharp blade slithering across the smooth surface of the ice, is a panacea for the longevity of the sport. The ice isn't conducive to serious injuries and yields to the nimble contortions of the skater.

Vienna-born, the ice urge brought Trenkler to the United States in the late 1930's after Sonja Henie had seen him. He skated with and for Sonja in ice shows and in movies before branching out.
