LORING JACOBS BAR MITZVAH

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli security officials have apprehended five Arabs and charged them with the bombing of five Haifa apartment buildings in which two Israelis died and 16 were injured.

The five were arrested during a series of security moves which also resulted in the capture of a boatload of Arab terrorists and explosives and the detention of 20 persons from the East Jerusalem area.

Israeli authorities gave the following details on the roundup:

An Israeli naval vessel intercepted a small craft off the Sinai Peninsula and discovered the boat contained a number of Arab terrorists - some of them former residents of Israel -- and explosives which were being delivered to sabotage organ-

izations in northern Israel. Security officials said the same methods still being used to deliver material to the terrorists and that the navy has intensified its surveillance activities along the coast.

During questioning, the saboteurs disclosed the names of five Arabs living in Acre, near Haifa, who were members of their terrorist group. These five men -- two drivers, two fishermen and a carpenter -- were picked up and they, in turn, implicated the 20 terrorists rounded up in the East Jerusalem area. This group had specialized in throwing grenades at buses and civilian vehicles.

The terrorists were members of El Fatah and a new group, the Popular Freedom Organization, Israeli authorities said.

1970 PASSION PLAY AJC TARGET

NEW YORK, - The American Jewish Congress voiced skepticism about a "revised" text of the anti-Semitic Oberammergau Passion Play and asked the Mayor of the West German Village for a look at it.

Mayor Ernst Zwink of Oberammergau announced that the village had adopted revisions which would "stand up to any criticism" and that rendered the traditional play "free of anti-Semitic overtones."

Dr. Joachim Prinz, chairman of the American Jewish Congress' Commission on International Affairs, expressed doubt.

"It is hard to have confidence in the competence and intentions of the Mayor and his friends when their position throughout has been that the original grossly anti-Semitic play was completely proper and acceptable," Dr. Prinz declared, adding:

"It is unlikely they can cure a defect they cannot even perceive."

In a cable to Mayor Zwink, Dr. Prinz requested that copies of the revised script be sent to him and to Father Stephan Schaller of the Monastery at Ettal, near Oberammergau.

Father Schaller is the Benedictine priest and educator who had been assigned by Julius Cardinal Doepfner, Archbishop of Munich, to revise the text. He submitted a new script, which was rejected by the Bavarian villagers. Last September, in a letter to Dr. Prinz, Father Schaller wrote of his frustration in dealing with the townspeople and noted that "the already weak will to reform the play disappeared completely" when Oberammergau was told by travel agents that the 1970 performances were sold out.

Mayor Zwink's latest announcement that revisions had been made followed a
