


BOB Among those comics who never fail to live up to expectations, Bob Newhart ranks near the top, His dry, subtle humor stimulates laughter at tradition, customs

Father Schaller is the Benedictine priest and educator who had been assigned by Julius Cardinal Doepfner, Archbishop of Munich, to revise the text.
