NEW YORK -- The American Jewish Congress called for "an immediate and total withdrawal of American troops from Vietnam" beginning with "a cessation of all offensive military operations."

In a resolution passed by its Governing Council, the Congress charged that "There has been no real progress toward peace" despite limited reductions in the U. S. military commitment and despite "the rhetoric of hope."

The resolution, which asks that the United States take the initiative in disengagement and not be bound by the Saigon Government in any course of action, sets forth a three-stage program:

"(1) Cessation of all offensive military operations. This is not to be construed as a denial of the necessity to take protective measures for self-defense.

"(2) Immediate and total withdrawal of American troops from Vietnam.

"(3) U. S. pressure upon Saigon to take immediate steps toward forming a truly representative government. As a first step toward the goal of free elections, all political prisoners must be released from jail and permitted to voice their views freely."

### ISRAEL RETALIATES

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli forces carried out an airborne raid on a major commando base in Djebel Ross in the foothills of Mount Hermon and reported killing 12 guerrillas, wounding many more and destroying huge quantities of munitions and supplies.

Israeli losses were listed as one officer killed and five soldiers wounded in the first strike across the Lebanese border since September and since the Beirut Government agreed to give the commandos a free hand in Southern Lebanon from which to raid Israel.

Foreign Minister Abba Eban said the strike was mounted because "our policy is to react to provocation." He noted that "since El Fatah and other organizations

political opinion" be allowed to participate and campaign in elections in which all South Vietnamese will be permitted to vote, "those elections to be held under international auspices and supervision."

The American Jewish Congress was the first Jewish organization to call for a change in U. S. policy in Vietnam. In April 1966, the organization called at its national biennial convention for suspension of U. S. bombing of North Vietnam and urged an immediate ceasefire. A resolution of the Governing Council last May urged a phased withdrawal of U. S. troops.

The call for immediate withdrawal of U. S. troops represents the conviction that "only in this way can the tragedy that is Vietnam be brought to an end," the new resolution declared.
