claim that they have the right permanently to kill us, we have a permanent right to take steps as will prevent them from killing us."  
The attack, which was preceded by a heavy artillery barrage and had air cover, was in direct response to a commando ambush of an Israeli motor convoy in the northern Golan Heights in which a civilian bus driver and a soldier were wounded. One truck was overturned and a bus was riddled. The attackers escaped.  
Beirut radio reported the raid and said that the Israeli force was driven off. It mentioned no Arab losses

but asserted that Jerusalem was attempting to undermine the Lebanese Government. The Beirut regime said it would take all necessary measures to protect the country but did not elaborate. Arab terrorists in Lebanon reported that 13 helicopters were used in the Israeli mission and that guerrillas from various organizations engaged the attackers in fierce fighting. The commandos said four of their men were killed and several wounded and asserted that Israelis suffered heavy losses. The casualty figures announced by Israel was described as ridiculous by the terrorists who declared the raid turned out to be a "little Karameh." Kar-

ameh refers to a terrorist base in Jordan attacked by Israel in March, 1968 and which the Arabs view as a great victory. The incident is given credit for triggering the growth of El Fath.  
In other military activities Israeli jets continued on a daily bases to pound Arab positions along the Suez Canal and the Jordan River. Tel Aviv reported that no planes were lost last week. One Israel soldier was killed during the week in an artillery exchange across the Canal. A number of others were injured in shelling as were some civilians. Military spokesmen said the jet raids against Egypt were designed to remind Cairo that Israel retains air superiority and any attempt to mount a full-scale offense against the Israeli-held east bank would be disastrous. The air strikes against Jordan were direct responses to artillery and mortar shelling of border settlements and attacks on border patrols. Guerrilla bases, when they are identified, are also hit by jets, spokesmen said. Within Israel, two trends cause concern to military leaders. One is the number of Israeli Arabs arrested in saboteur roundups. More

**NEW LOW FARES TO ISRAEL**

Sharply reduced fares for winter travel to Israel have been filed with the Civil Aeronautics Board by El Al Israel Airlines this week.  
The most popular economy group fare to Israel of \$535.00 for groups of 25 or more has been reduced to \$499.00 for a minimum stay of eight days to one year. The size of the group has been reduced from 25 to 15 with no change in stop-over privileges.  
Another group fare of \$499.00 for a minimum stay of eight days to thirty days has been reduced to \$449.00 with group size reduction from 25 to 15. Stop-over privileges as before.  
A new "week-day only" fare of \$399.00 for groups of 15, with minimum stay from 8 to a maximum stay of 21 days, will go into effect after the first of the year. This fare includes no mandatory land arrangements.
