

9 ISRAELIS KILLED LAST WEEK

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israeli pilots downed three Syrian MIGs in a series of dogfights with the Russian-built craft over Damascus as residents of the city watched from below.

But the downing of the three Arab fighters was tempered by the death of nine Israelis including two civilians as a result of terrorist and regular Arab army action. The casualties were sustained on all of Israel's front lines facing its Arab

neighbors. The MIGs were shot down after the Syrians attempted to intercept Israeli jets carrying out a mission against Arab forces on the Golan Heights. A military spokesman said that gun fire and air-to-air missiles downed the MIGs. Only one Surain pilot was seen bailing out.

In other military activities, Egyptian commandoes ambushed a patrol vehicle along the Suez Canal and killed one Israeli soldier. A-

nother was wounded while a third, identified as a captain, was missing and believed captured by the Arabs. Three other soldiers were killed during various Egyptian artillery and mortar attacks along the canal, military spokesman said. One soldier was killed when an army vehicle hit a mine in the Golan Heights.

Mines were responsible for the death of one civilian, and the injury of three others, all students, when two shoe mines were detonated in separate incidents in the northern Jordan Valley. The other civilian death occurred when a group of boys threw rocks at a package in Mevasseret near Jerusalem. The package exploded, killing a 12-year-old and injuring four other boys.

Two soldiers were killed in two separate incidents along the Jordan front. One died when a bazooka shell hit a patrol vehicle with five soldiers near the Damita Bridge. The others were injured. The second Israeli was killed during an artillery and motor exchange with Jordanian forces near the Mandassah Bridge.

Arab terrorists have stepped up their activity from their Lebanese bases and during one raid fought a two-hour battle with Israeli settlers in the town of Metulla in northern Israel. Two civilians were injured. The terrorist fired bazookas and automatic weapons into the town after dark and residents returned the fire.

PREMIER INSTALLS NEW GOVT.

JERUSALEM (ENS) ---- The Knesset has installed Israeli new Government, a broadly-based coalition of six parties led by Premier Golda Meir.

The 24-member Cabinet covers almost the entire Israeli political spectrum and commands the loyalty of the six parties which hold 102 out of the 120 Knesset seats.

The Cabinet members are: Golda Meir, Prime Minister; Yigal Allon, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Education; Moshe Dayan, Minister of Defense; Abba Eban, Foreign Minister; Pinbas Saphir, Finance; Zeev Sharef, Housing; Joseph Almogi, Labor; Israel Galili, Minister Without Portfolio; Shlomo Hillel, Police; Yaacov Shimshon Shapira, Justice; Shimon Peres, Minister Without Portfolio; Chaim Gvati, Agriculture; Menachem Beigin, Minister Without Portfolio; Joseph Saphir, Trade and Industry; Gen. Ezer Weizman, Transport; Elimelech Rimall, Post; Chaim Landau, Development; Aryeh Leon Dulzin, Minister Without Portfolio; Moshe Chaim Shariro, Interior, Dr. Joseph Burg, Social Welfare; Dr. Zerah Warhaftig, Religion; Moshe Kol, Tourism; Israel Barzilai and Victor Shemtov, Ministers Without Portfolio. The two latter members have the option to take over the ministries of health and absorption respectively.

bers were sworn in except for Mr. Eban who is visiting the United States. He will be sworn in on his return.

In her inaugural address, Mrs. Meir directed her remarks to the international scene, the Arab states and "those nations that, standing from afar, keep the Arabs off the road to peace." She pledged to keep the nation's military strength at its present all-time high and to retain the occupied territories and the current cease-fire lines until there is a true peace in the Mideast.

The Government policies in the new territories which the Premier described as a firm hand but with minimum interference with local authorities -- had succeeded, she said, and terrorists have been unable to gain recruits from the local populace. She also said that Israel's overall situation had not been weakened by the Arab's war of attrition and that the Arab states were suffering from their policy of no peace, no negotiations.
