Evans is Metromedia's po-

litical analyst and co-author of the nationally syndicated newspaper column - The Evans-Novak Report. Tuohy is the Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist from the L.A. Times.

The 60-minute show offers an in-depth look at the 71-year-old American-born matriarch, of whom many Israelis expressed disappointment when she was named interim Premier last March upon the death of Levi Eshkol. They claimed, "We wanted national dynamic leadership but all we got was a grandmother."

The Evans-Tuohy team also obtained Mrs. Meir's views on a myriad of Mid-East problems, including: continuing Israeli-Egyptian border flare-ups, air strikes and the behind-the-scenes "diplomatic chess game that keeps the Mid-East on the brink of volcanic eruption."

Mrs. Meir served as interim Premier for eight months. Prior to that, she had headed the powerful Labor Party of Israel. On Oct. 28, she was elected to a full four-year term.

A prestigious political leader in Israel for many years, Premier Meir is a dedicated supporter of the Zionists, whose position on the Arab-Israeli conflict is reported to be one of militancy and absolute rejection of big power "imposed solutions" to the Middle East crisis.

"This is an awful job," Mrs. Meir once told a visitor to Israel. "It's not the work. God knows before I came to this office I was not given an opportunity to be spoiled by leisure. I only dreamed about it. But the responsibility; it's an

awful strain, I imagine it would be at any time, but at this time . . ."

I'd pick Harry Houdini, who became even more famous as an escape artist.

I once stood backstage at the Orpheum Theatre in Los Angeles when Houdini promised he'd return to this earth following his death. Ever since he died on Halloween Eve in 1926, Harry hasn't enjoyed any measure of success in making the return trip.

Spiritualists everywhere have attempted to contact Houdini's departed spirit and help escort him back to this vale of tears. In this case, the spirit may be willing but it's also weak. Even Harry's late wife kept the faith and tried regularly. She gave up to ghost, so to speak, in 1936 and died a few years later.
