## AJC HAILS VATICAN STATEMENT

NEW YORK - The American jewish Congress hailed the Vatican-approved statement on Catholic Jewish relations as "a deepening of Christian understanding of Judaism and the Jewish people" that recognizes "the indispensible role of the land of Israel in Jewish life."

In a comment on the docurnent -- made public by Archbishop of Baltimore --Rabbi Arthur J. Lelyveld of Israeli Foreign Minister Cleveland, president of the Congress, declared:
