Snow Says Jews 70ps

According to C. P. Snow, the eminent British scientist and writer of fiction, the Jews are a superior people. According to Mr. Snow, there are also two disparate worlds, that of science and that of culture. Is he defining the Jews' excellence as a scientist or as a writer of fiction?

The concept, of course, is now new. It is perhaps questionable although flattering. It matches in many ways the legent that the Jews were a chose people when in fact, according to another legend, God had to threaten the Jews in order to make them accept their relationship with Him.

The British thinker is going by empirical factors such as the larger number of Jews on the lists of world achievement in the fields of science and creativity. There has been no evidence of genes or chromosomes inhabiting the Jewish corpus or psyche to prove this. There is a tradition of learning; there is a history of oppression and perhaps the combination has motivated the Jewish people towards excellence.

However, after the Hitler Holocaust, the renaissance in some parts of the world of anti-Semitism, including our own domicile, it is good to hear we are an elite people in the better sense of the word. Even if it is not a hundred percent true,

Gordis on Steinback



Where the atmosphere abounds with so much brightness, we've got some awfully dull dailies.

Tourists, by the millions, gape and stare and are aweinspired by the wonders of our city. Then they pick up a local newspaper, and suffer the first let-down. The fire and
excitement of the never, never land of Las Vegas is depleted by the triteness of our gazettes. The complacence
of the publishers and managing editors, wallowing in a
prosperity unmatched, is a sore spot as apparent as
a slipped pad of a chorus girl's bra.

All that will be changed with the arrival on the scene of the Free Press. Here, at last, will be a newspaper worthy of association with our great and glorious city. It will reflect everything that makes Las Vegas the extraordinary community it is. It will have life, excitement, agitation and magnetism. It will be what a tourist will expect in a town of our magnitude. At the same time the locals will eat it up. Here's why. They are fed up with the present fodder.

The purpose of the Free Press is to clear the air on matters that need clearing. It will be dedicated to total freedom of thought and expression. Impositions against humanity will be aired, puncturing stuffed shirts, exposing sacred cows and deflating those inflated with delusions of grandeur.

In short, the Free Press will be a protest paper. If there is a man anywhere who don't have a protest in him, he just "ain't" alive. It is being brought to us by youth, with a fresh, vibrant approach demanding change. But oldsters as well, will take advantage of this medium of expression. There isn't a soul among us who doesn't desire to improve the world. Here is the opportunity all have been waiting for.

Confronted with the present predicaments of turmoil and strife there should be no barriers to total communication in meeting the frustrations of society. No voice should be stilled in the battle of the 70's. Never before have there been so many areas of complete disparity. Our political system is outmoded, education is in utter chaos, civil rights is torn between racism and irresponsibility, business-labor relations is wracked with wanton greed, religion lacks benovolence, and the revolution of youth is adamant.

Youth, that's the big word, the key that will open the door to a new threshhold for life and society. Youth will solve all problems, bring us out of our frustrations. The adage: "Youth, too bad it is wasted on the young," does not hold water in this day and age. The youth know where they are going and no power on Earth can stop them. It's just a matter of time. Their target is the establishment.

But through a quirk of circumstance, the very establishment the youth is fighting, also has its protests against higher levels of the same establishment. Thus we have district attorneys, like George Franklin, protesting bitterly against decrees of the U.S. Supreme Court protecting the rights of individuals. Law enforcement agencies are in constant conflict with governing superiors over more men, more money and less hours. We firmly believe that for every act of police brutality, there are ten times more sheriffs and police chiefs in our nation who will tolerate nothing less than fair and humane administration in their departments, Sheriff Lamb in Clark County and Police Chief Witcher in Las Vegas are decent, kind, understanding officials. They will discipline any man in uniform who takes it on himself to usurp the rules of decent treatment for any citizens.

That's what the Free Press is all about. That's why the district attorney and law enforcement agencies will welcome this new medium of expression. These farsighted men know the tremendous benefits that will accrue to the community by an open forum for protest from all quarters, including their own. Wait and see.

Naturally, the objections against establishment by youth will be a predominant factor in the Free Press. They got more to beef about than all others combined. But the protests will be in good taste, legal and intelligent. There will be no rabble-rousing, inducement of violence or advocation to break any law. Honest argument to change laws, yes. Breaking laws, never. Criticism of officials and official acts? Indubitably. Name calling? Out of the question. Outspoken? By all means. Arrogant? No.

The Free Press will be an appeal to reason and logic.
