# STATE DEPT. ARAB SELLOUT

### ISRAELIS CAPTURE 22 LEBANESE

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Israeli jets, carrying the main brunt of the fighting in the Mideast, downed three Syrian MiB-21s in dogfights over the Golan Heights and struck deep inside Egypt in air raids while Israeli missilemen in the Sinai blasted two Egyptian Sukho-7s bombers during an Arab air strike across the Gulf of Suez.

The Syrian jets were intercepted as they approached the cease-fire line over the Golan Heights and were downed by aerial cannon and air-to-air missiles.

The two Egyptian bombers were shot down by anti-aircraft missiles when the two planes crossed the Gulf and attacked an Israeli position near Ras Sudr, 25 miles south of the Suez Canal. The two bombers strafed Israeli positions and injured one soldier before being hit by the missiles. No bombs were dropped.

Israel continued its intensified military activities in the Mideast by carrying out a commando raid into Lebanon, downing two Egyptian jets during its daily series of air strikes along the Suez Canal and disclosing that a raid into that Arab state netted a new, seven-ton Russian-built radar station designed to pick up low-flying fighters.

The raid into Leganon resulted in the capture of 22 men - nine soldiers and 13 civilians, four of whom were released when they established they were not Arab guerrillas--who are being held as hostages for exchange for an Israeli farmer, Samuel Rosenwasser, 54, who was kidnapped by Arab

NEW YORK--A National Emergency Conference of Jewish leadership on Peace in the Middle East has been called by the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations for January 25 and 26 in Washington, D.C., it was announced by Rabbi Herschel Schacter, Chairman of the Presidents Conference.

The meeting will be held against the background of rising concern in the American Jewish community over what has been described as a "serious erosion" in State Department policy on a Middle East settlement.

Participating in the two-day National Emergency Conference, to be held in the Statler Hilton, will be representatives of all the 24

constituent organizations of the Presidents Conference. Important leaders of Jewish communities across the country and others will be invited.

In issuing the call for the meeting, Rabbi Schacter referred to the meeting of the Presidents Conference delegation with Secretary of State William P. Rogers on December 22 when he conveyed to Secretary Rogers the Jewish community's "deep concern and apprehension" over the recent U.S. proposals on the Middle East.

Following the lengthy and substantive meeting with Secretary Rogers, Rabbi Schacter issued a statement warning that the U.S. plan for a Middle East settlement would "strengthen Arab intransigence and Soviet designs and lead to an imposed settlement rather than a negotiated peace between the parties--the stated policy of our government."

The forthcoming Conference is expected to be the largest and most representative gathering of American Jewish leadership since the Presidents Conference Emergency Meeting in Washington during the Six-Day War in 1967.

NEW YORK (LNS) - Lubavitcher Chassidim all over the world will mark an historic milestone on the tenth day of the Hebrew calendar month of Shevat, this year on Saturday, January 17.

On this day, the Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Menachem M. Schneerson, will have completed twenty years as world leader of the Chabad-Lubavitch movement.

Under his guidance the movement has developed so that its influence now transcends the world of Lubavitch and even the Chassidic community at large, and deeply penetrates, directly and indirectly, the mainstream of Jewish life in all parts of the world. The movement has, in fact, become the most vibrant and dynamic force in the Jewish world today.

### FRENCH ADMIT MASSIVE ARMS ARAB DEAL

PARIS (WNS) -- The French Government has officially acknowledged that it will sell Libya 50 Mirage jet fighter-bombers as part of a massive arms deal with that Arab nation.

(In the United States the Nixon Administration was reported to be inclined to sell additional F-4 Phantom jet fighter-bombers to Israel despite diplomatic differences over peace proposals for the Mideast. Washington was pictured as convinced that further American arms supplies to Jerusalem would deter Arab aggression, inhibit Jerusalem from launching a pre-emptive war and avoid a U.S.-Russian nuclear confrontation by keeping Israeli power carefully balanced.)
