FRADULENT, WORTHLESS FRENCH PROMISES CAUSE

ISRAELI RELATIONS BREACH

ISRAELI LEADER FOR APPEASEMENT

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Arie Eliav, newly elected secretary-general of Israel's ruling Labor Party has suggested that his nation recognize that the Palestinian Arabs "exist as an infant nation" and that Israel annex only Jerusalem. Mr. Eliav, in an interview in Time Magazine, said he spoke for Israel's "silent majority" who recognized that there has to be recogni-

zation of a "legitimate Arab national movement" and this should be in the form of an Arab state.

Mr. Eliav's remarks are in direct contradiction with that of Premier Golda Meir. But they mirror proposals made by other Israeli leaders in public and private. One suggestion by Foreign Minister Abba Eban that the end of the Mideast conflict could involve Israeli talks,

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israeli-French relations have reached the lowest point ever as Ambassador Abba Eban concealed his trip to Paris after implying that the French Government made fraudulent and worthless promises.

(On the French side of the affair, Foreign Minister Maurice Schumann told a closed door meeting of a Gaullist Party parliamentary group that Paris "will not deliver a single Mirage to Israel" and will do nothing "to endanger" France's newly won popularity with the Arab countries.)

Mr. Eban, speaking in the Knesset, leveled the sharpest attack ever made against France during an attack on Paris' arms deal with Libya which included the sale of 50 Mirage jets to that Arab nation. The Foreign Minister asserted that a high ranking French official had assured Israeli representatives just a month ago that the Libyan arms deal might never be made. He accused the French Government of calculating misleading the world, including Israel and conducting "camouflage

maneuvers" to "conceal the truth and all the while putting the final touches to the large scale arms agreement with an Arab country that has declared itself part of the struggle against Israel."

France, Mr. Eban declared, has promised Israel several times that if Jerusalem renounced its claims to the 50 embargoed Mirages, the planes would not be released to any Arab state. But 50 of the same model Mirage are going to Libya and efforts to get the embargoed jets released to Israel have proved fruitless.

Paris was motivated by "economics and the smell of oil," Mr. Eban declared and asserted that "France, has become, with the Soviet Union, the most active element in upsetting the balance of security and peace in the Middle East."

(Mr. Schumann seemed to support Mr. Eban's view. In his talk with the Gaullist group he was reported to have said that the Government's chief preoccupation was to do nothing that could endanger France's popularity in the Arab world. He

LECTURES TO BE HELD AT TEMPLE

Prof. Louis Shub, until recently the Director of the Israel Office of the American Jewish Committee, will deliver two lectures at Temple Beth Shalom, regarding the Middle East Arab-Israeli situation.

Dr. Jack Hirsh, Chairman of the Temple's Adult Education Committee, stated that Mr. Shub's theme will be "Israel in Profile". His first lecture will be held on Thursday evening, January 29 at 8 p.m. His subject will be "Options for Peace in the Middle East." His second talk will take place on Friday evening, January 30 at subject will be "The Impact of Israel on the Global Mainstream". Prof. Shub will conduct a question and answer period at the conclusion of each address.

Israel Strikes Deep

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel continued its deep penetration of Egypt by sending air and land forces as close as eight miles to Cairo in addition to continuing its almost daily pounding of Arab positions along the Suez Canal and Gulf of Suez.

One Israeli jet was owned by anti-aircraft fire while attacking a communications junction 37 miles east of the canal city of Port Suez. The pilot was being bailing out over Egypt and reports from Cairo later indicated he was captured.

(Cairo radio reported that three Israeli jets were shot down during this raid and the other crafts were driven off. Jerusalem said only one plane was lost).

The position hit by the jets was also attacked by Israeli commandos who reported destroying the main
