version as performed only under Orthodox rites.
The result of all this opposition, observers said, was a possible defeat for the Cabinet bill in a secret vote. But the Meir Government could stop such a move by declaring that a vote on the bill was a vote of confidence in the Government, a proper step to take when the matter before the Knesset was an important as the proposed legislation.

Such a move could result in the bill passing the Knesset. If this happened, then another problem arises. The NRP has opposed the liberal elements in the measure and they could leave the Government if these provisions are not changed. Some members of Herut also support the religious position and they too could be expected to leave. If there were such a break away from the ruling coalition, Premier Meir would be left with a minority Government. She could decide to continue to govern and hope to form a new majority coalition or she could resign, ending her mandate.

Observers noted that the latter move leading to a new national election would only transfer the political problem from within the Knesset to the entire nation and polarize Israel on this issue at a time when it faced serious external dangers.

lot who was previously listed as missing after his jet was shot down by anti-aircraft fire while on a patrol over the Golan Heights. The pilot's death was Israel's most serious loss during four days of shooting on the Heights. A number of soldiers were reported wounded during these series of engagements with Syrian forces and Jerusalem lost some equipment. It reported direct hits on Arab tanks, artillery positions and other strongpoints.

The four Israelis were killed by an Egyptian commando ambush near Kantara. The Israeli forces returned the fire and drove back the Egyptians who were covered by artillery fire from the Arab side of the waterway. Israel reported at least five Egyptians were killed.

The other Israel losses included one soldier killed during a clash with terrorists in a refugee camp in the Gaza Strip, another during shooting along the Canal and the third during a brief engagement with terrorist in the Arab district of Hte Negev. Four of the Arab guerillas were killed in this battle.

In addition to the battle casualties, two Israeli civilians were killed in the explosion of a military industrial plant north of Tel Aviv. The location of the plant and the material being manufactured were withheld by Israeli censors. The number of men killed in the Elath mine explosion incident rose to 24 when another of the men injured in that accident died in a hospital.

The commando raid was one of a number carried out by Egypt. The others were repulsed with no losses. In one case, the Israeli forces ambushed the Arab attackers and claimed a number of

Arabs were killed. Israel's naval losses were attributed to the work of Egyptian frogmen. A 500-ton supply ship was sunk by mines attached to the hull

below the water line. A landing craft was also mined but was beached before it sank. Israel said no men were lost in the attack. Within 15 hours after the

frogmen raid, Israeli jets spotted a 700-ton Egyptian minelayer in the Gulf of Suez and sank the ship. (Cairo claimed the ship was a 120-ton supply vessel.)
