AJC REVEALS ARAB ARMS COULD CAUSE

New York - The French-Libyan arms deal is the focal point of political controversy in France today and could split the Pompidou regime, a report from the American Jewish Committee's European headquarters in Paris reveals. The report was issued here today by the Committee.

The possible split in the government, the report states, has stemmed from a recent address by Michel Poniatowski, General Secretary of the Independent Republican Party, one of the groups making up the coalition cabinet. Mr. Poniatowski is also a close confidant of Finance Minister Valery Giscard d'Estaing.

In his address, the Republican Secretary attacked French foreign policy as "full of paradoxes." He

singled out Defense Minister Michel Debre for special condemnation, labelling him an "international arms merchant."

In reply, President Pompidou issued a statement urging that parties in the coalition government hold together on major issues. Prime Minister Jacques Chaban Delmas went even further, stating that it was intolerable to be in a coalition with a party, one of whose leaders so flagrantly disavows the government's policies.

The AJC report adds that newspapers in France have continued strong criticism of the government, including direct accusations of lying. As a countermeasure, the report declares, President Pompidou recently

ORTHODOX VIEW TO BE JEW

JERUSALEM (WNS)--The Knesset is expected to adopt the Orthodox view of who is a Jew after overwhelmingly

voting approval of a controversial amendment to the Law of Return on its first reading.

The measure sponsored by the Government and personally backed by Premier Golda Meir must gain approval in two further readings in the Knesset. Its final passage is assured after the Labor Party decided that all party members vote to support the bill.

As presented by the Government, the bill amends the Law of Return by defining as Jew as someone born of a Jewish mother or converted. This is the Orthodox view as contained in the Halacha.

The amendment also liberalizes the law by extending the rights and privileges

ARAB, ISRAEL BIG AIR LOSSES

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Both Israel and Egypt suffered their greatest losses in land and air engagements since the end of the Six-Day War as each side successfully carried out major strikes against the other.

Egypt's losses totaled more than 70 civilians killed during a bombing of a metal works factory 13 miles north of Cairo. Israel said the attack was a "technical error" and Defense Minis-

ter Moshe Dayan, in an unprecedented move in warfare, informed the Egyptian Government through the Red Cross and the United Nations that one of the bombs dropped was a 1,000 pound bomb set to explode 24 hours after being released. Egyptian demolition experts disarmed the device.

Israeli military spokesman said the bombing was being investigated. They

Responsibility for the attack at Munich rests with the Arab governments. They are actively participating in the organization, financing and training of the terror organizations and in the direction of their operations. They are abusing the decencies of diplomatic relations by trying to extend to individual perpetrators - of murderous terror acts, even when they have been caught red-handed and placed on trial, their diplomatic protection - a matter which has been most flagrant in the recent trial in Zurich.
The responsibility of the Arab governments goes even further, for it is they which have encouraged the spread of a psychosis favorable to such sneak and cowardly attacks and have been glamorizing them.
