## U.S. JEWS DON'T LIKE POMPIDOU BRUSH

The following statement was issued Monday (March 2) by Dr. William A. Werler, chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations and Philip Hoffman, president of the American Jewish Committee, following cancellation of its appointment with French President Georges Pompidou.

"We are dismayed at President Pompidou's sudden decision to cancel his meeting with us -- a decision we first learned about not from his office but from a local radio news reporter.

"Our delegation members, representing the national leadership of the Jewish Community, have travelled thousands of miles to New York to accept President

Pompidou's invitation to meet with him, Without offering any reason, he decided not to appear.

"We are appalled at this act of discourtesy, which is an affront not only to the American Jewish community but to the gracious traditions of the people of France.

"Had Monsieur Pompidou not rescinded his invitation after we had gathered to meet with him, we would have urged him to lift the arms embargo against Israel and to deliver to Israel the 50 Mirage jets bought and paid for. President Pompidou's anti-Israel pro-Arab policy shocks the many friends of France, for we recall the genuine sympathy and know that even now the majority of Frenchmen repudiate their government's onesided policy and share our apprehension over the course pursued by the Pompidou regime.

"This course jeopardizes the cause of peace in the Middle East and encourages Arab refusal to accept a cease-fire and to negotiate a peace settlement with Israel.

"Despite Monsieur Pompidou's rudeness we urge our fellow-Americans to act in > an orderly, peaceful and nonviolent manner in exercising their democratic right to communicate to Monsieur Pompidou and to the world their justifiable indignation over the dangers to the cause of world peace represented by French policy."
