CLEVELAND (WNS) -- The first phase of Cleveland's participation in the first national Jewish population study ended as interviews with some 250 families were finished and a new group of volunteers prepared to begin the second phase which aims at completing interviewing 800 are

NEW YORK, N.Y. -- Rabbi Herschel Schacter, newly elected Chairman of the American Jewish Conference on Soviet Jewry stated: "The 39 incredibly brave Soviet Jews whose agonized plea to the Soviet authorities for permission to emigrate to Israel have given the lie most dramatically to the charade of recent Soviet press conferences in which Soviet "show Jews" have recited by rote obviously coerced attacks on Israel and renunciations of Jewish affinities.

NEW YORK - Over 300 dancers in 16 Israel folk dance groups participated in the two performances of the 19th Annual Israel Dance Festival, which took place at Madison Square Garden's Felt Forum in New York. The overflow performances of the dance pageant "Pages of our History" were sponsored by the American Zionist Youth Foundation.

NEW YORK -- With the recent presentation of 102 torah scrolls to synagogues and institutions in the southern Negev region, about half of the 3,100 scrolls brought to Israel from Rumania by the Joint Distribution Committee have now been distributed.

NEW YORK -- The ever-increasing incidence of intermarriage between Jews and non-Jews threatens the survival of Judiasm in the United States, according to Dr. Marshall Sklare, professor of sociology at Yeshive University, and currently visiting professor of American Jewish Studies at Brandels University.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- A second group of Black Jews from the United States who had tried to establish a settlement in Liberia, has been given temporary residence in Dimona after arriving unexpectedly in Israel. The 49 newcomers, who had been residents of Chicago, joined an earlier group that was sent to the Negev township after their arrival two months ago. Both groups contend they are Jewish and claim the Right of Return. They have been given temporary residence visas pending clarification of their status as immigrants. The Chief Rabbinate insists that they undergo conversion.

OTTAWA (WNS) -- A Canadian Parliament committee on the mass media was told by the Rev. A.C. Forrest, editor of the United Church Observer, that the Canadian press had a "pro-Zionist bias."

BONN (WNS) -- West German Foreign Minister Walter Scheel said he would visit Israel in the fall and he didn't care whether the Arabs liked it or not.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The United Nations Human Rights Commission has adopted a resolution urging member states to take measures for "the speedy and final eradication of Nazism" and to arrest and extradite persons who have committed war crimes.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Israel Corp., an investmane and holding company of world Jewish financiers was set up at the international economic conference for Israel held last spring, has purchased the Zim Lines, Israel's national shipping company, from the Government for
