owned in the country. Until now, Jews had been permitted, on occasion, to transfer small sums out of the country to pay for schooling for their children aboard. It is feared that even this limited freedom by Jews to make use of their assets may no longer be possible, the report indicates.

As to the Jewish property that has been confiscated or sequestered, the report concludes, there has so far been no indication that the Libyan authorities are prepared to offer any compensation.

U.S. SENATOR ASKS ADMINISTRATION DISPEL INCONSISTENCIES

NEW YORK -- "Peace in the Middle East is threatened not by Israel but by the Arab extremists and by the short-sighted men in Moscow and in Paris who are encouraging Arab belligerence," Senator Charles Goodell (R., N.Y.) told the New York Chapter of the American Jewish Committee.

Speaking at a chapter luncheon at the Plaza Hotel, Senator Goodell described the Middle East proposal announced last December by Secretary of State William P. Rogers as "a prescription not for peace but for further aggravation of tensions."

However, he expressed "gratification" with some of President Nixon's recent statements on the Middle East, including the statement he made to Jewish leaders in January that "the United States is prepared to supply military equipment necessary

to support the efforts of friendly Governments, like Israel's, to defend the safety of their people." Goodell stated, is whether or not it follows through on that promise.

The luncheon was the second in a series of three Sunday forums sponsored this season by AJC's New York Chapter, of which Edward D. Moldover is President and Frederic S. Berman, former New York City Commissioner of Rent and Housing Maintenance, is chairman of the luncheon forum series.

"It is a matter of concern," Senator Goodell declared, "when the Administration from time to time announces apparently divergent policies that are interpreted now as pro-Arab, now as even-handed, and now as pro-Israel."

"It is time to dispel such inconsistencies, and once

and for all reassert firmly our commitments to the state of Israel and to a peace based on direct negotiation and full mutual recognition of all the states in the area."

Commenting on the part of Secretary Rogers' plan that would require Israel to relinquish the territories gained in the Arab-Israel

war of June 1967, Senator Goodell declared:

"To expect Israel to surrender the territories occupied since 1967 without direct negotiations or adequate safeguards would not only sacrifice Israel's vital interests but would be further encouragement of Arab intransigence."

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- El Al officials said that rigid security measures in effect for the airline have made it almost impossible to hijack its jets. While the officials didn't disclose the security measures, El Al was one of a number of airlines reported to be using an American-developed device that detects the odor of explosives. The device was developed under a Federal grant at the Illinois Institute of Technology and further improved by Israeli scientists.

PARIS (WNS) -- Wild rumors that young girls have been sold into white slavery have been circulated against businessmen, mainly Jewish, in the French towns of Amiens and Perigneux. Hardest hit have been women's clothing stores which were described as almost being empty. The businessmen in Amiens have filed complaints with police and other government officials, but the businessmen in Perigneux have so far made no complaints.

NEW YORK -- The New York Board of Rabbis, joined by more than one thousand adults and children, held a "Call to Conscience" Service at the Isaiah Wall of the U.S. at the time that French President Pompidou was received by U. Thant.

NEW YORK -- Kennedy Airport halted all departures Sunday, March 1st, as a sign of the bereavement of the entire airport community when the traditional "Moloch" was chanted at the International Synagogue in memory of the 47 who lost their lives in the sabotaged Swissair plane in February. This is the first time in the history of Kennedy Airport that departures were stopped in order to commemorate any event. The clergyment of the neighboring chapels at the Airport syndronized their Memorial Prayers with those of the International Synagogue.
