

AJ CONGRESS, B'NAI B'RITH CALL PASSION PLAY ANTI-SEMITIC

The American Jewish Congress and the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith called on the Archbishop of Munich not to attend or associate himself with the Oberammergau

Passion Play because the text "remains deeply hostile to Jews and Judaism."

The Jewish groups also said they would ask "all men of good will to refrain from promoting or attending" the play, which will open May 18 in the Bavarian village.

Reports from West Germany that Julius Cardinal Doepfner planned to attend the Passion Play opening, and an examination by the two organizations of the revised script, prompted a joint cable to the Cardinal from Rabbi Arthur J. Lelyveld, president of the Ameri-

can Jewish Congress, and Dore Schary, national chairman of the Anti-Defamation League.

Charging that "the idea that the Jewish people bears a collective guilt and suffers a collective rejection by God still permeates the text, despite the admonitions of the Vatican Council," Mr. Schary and Rabbi Lelyveld urged the Catholic prelate to dissociate himself from the production. They said his presence could be "misconstrued as endorsement by the Church" of a play in which "Jews are still id-

entified as the principal malefactors who scheme to bring about the death of Jesus."

After an American Jewish Congress protest in November 1966 charged the play was "notoriously anti-Semitic," a Benedictine Monk, Father Stephen Schaller, was assigned by Cardinal Doepfner to prepare a new text.

Last August, however, Father Schaller wrote to the Congress that his script had been rejected and that he saw "no hope" for effective revision.
