HAPPY PASSOVER

PHILADELPHIA (WNS) -- Stores in the Philadelphia ghetto area, once heavily pwned by Jewish merchants, are now almost one-third owned by Negroes, a study conducted by the Jewish Community Relations Council and Temp, University's Center for Community Studies showed.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Miss Angel Brooks, president of the United Nations General Assembly, disclosed during the end of her visit to Israel that she had passed on requests from Former Soviet Jews for freedom for relatives to emigrate to Israel to Russian Communist Party chairman Alexei N. Kosygin, but noted there had been no response so far from Moscow. Miss Brooks said she had found no real hostility between Jews and Arab and she believed that both could live together.

NEW YORK: Over 50 computers made by the Elbit company of Israel are being exported to Britain this year. The completely Israeli designed and manufactured data processing system, trade-named Validata, is built around Elbit's "100" desk size digital computer. The whole system is offered for approximately \$50,000.

NEW YORK -- Leaders of the Jewish Federations and community councils across the nation expected to see a rash of sit-ins by Jewish activists demanding greater local support for Jewish education, cultural needs and youth activities following a six-hour sit-in at the headquarters of the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies in New York.

NEW YORK: The real goal of those advocating Federal and state aid to religious schools, including the forces seeking repeal of New York's so-called "Blaine Amendment," is "parity" -- the same expenditure per pupil in parochial schools as is spent in public schools. This charge is documented in a study just issued by the American Jewish Congress entitled, "Parity...A New Kind of Separate But Equal," by Joseph B. Robison, director of the Congress' Commission on Law and Social Action. Mr. Robison defines "parity" as the concept "that government should finance private and parochial schools to the same extent that its finances public schools...that whatever public funds are spent to educate children in public schools."

NEW YORK: The first electronic microcircuits on silicon wafers to be made in Israel were produced recently by the staff of the electrical engineering department of the Technion, Israel's technical university.

NEW YORK: A national competition has been launched in Israel for the submission of architectural plans for the first home for the aged to be built with the help of the recently established Association for the Planning and Development of Services for the Aged.
