TY HILBRECHT FOR ASSEMBLY

Assemblyman Norman Ty Hilbrecht announced he will be a candidate for re-election to the State Assembly as a representative of Clark County District 4.

Hilbrecht, a Democrat who was first elected to the Legislature in 1966 was chosen by the press corps at the State Capitol in Carson City as the outstanding freshman legislator in 1967 and last year received the designation of Outstanding Nevada Legislator from Eagleton Institute of Politics at Rutgers University.

He currently is chairman of the Sub-Committee on Government Merger and Consolidation and a member of the Taxation, Government Affairs and Elections Committees of the Assembly.

An active community and civic leader, Hilbrecht graduated from Las Vegas High School in 1952, and went on to graduate from Northwestern University, where he was picked Phi Beta Kappa, and Yale University Law School, where he received the coveted C. LaRue Munson Award for his scholarly achievements.

Hilbrecht has been in the practice of law in Las Vegas since 1959 and currently is a member of the firm of Hilbrecht, Jones & Schreck, 717 South Third Street.

Active in Democratic political affairs in Clark County and the state, Hilbrecht was first vice chairman of the County Democratic Central Committee, 1966-1968, and a member of the committee since 1960. He served as temporary and permanent chairman of the Clark

County Democratic Convention in 1966 and permanent chairman of the state convention in the same year.

His civic and organization activities have been many, including membership in the Fraternal Order of Police, where he served as vice president in 1968; Legal Aid Society, The Elks, Junior Chamber of Commerce, the National Conference of Christians and Jews, Las Vegas Rotary, Young Democrat Club of Las Vegas and Nevada Young Democrats, American Society for Public Administration, and a number of honorary affiliations.

WALTER BARING FOR CONGRESSMAN

Congressman Walter S. Baring, D-Nev., will seek his tenth term to the U.S. House of Representatives from Nevada.

Congressman Baring said, "It is time for America to secure the homefront necessities of life and encourage more active participation by Americans of all walks of life to work toward an even better and stronger country. I am renewing my pledge to Nevada and all America to continue to strive for the best for everyone in this nation."

The veteran Congressman, who is the third-ranking Democrat on both the House Interior and Insular Affairs Committee and the Veterans' Affairs Committee, said that he remains as Nevada's staunch supporter of the U.S. Constitution and vowed that he would do his utmost to uphold the principles of the Constitution.

He also vowed his support of the Democratic party principles as laid down by Thomas Jefferson, the founder of the Democratic party. Baring said, he, like Jefferson, "would continue to guard the Democratic party against radicals and ultra left-wing liberals who would destroy the party and the U.S. Constitution."

"Being a Constitutional Jeffersonian Democrat," the Nevada Congressman said, "I am unalterably opposed to the so-called 'New Federalism' or family assistance welfare program and have voted against it in the House of Representatives."

He said he could not condone any type of a guaranteed income program and he added that that is what the family assistance bill would do. "I believe in

the tried and true American way of working for a living and I cannot sanction guaranteed incomes for the too many welfare recipients who refuse to work."

He called the rising crime rate in the country a national disgrace and that he wanted to pursue his efforts to bring it under control.

He said if he was re-elected to the U.S. Congress he would continue his fight against the wave of pornography, obscenity and drug addiction and those anarchistic forces which seek to capture the minds of American youth.

"I want to give American youth more opportunity, but the young students today must show their gratefulness and appreciation for what America has given them and they must be actively engaged in a peaceful manner to lend a helping hand to make America a stronger country," Baring said.

He said, "I have introduced and worked hard for new and effective legislation to protect the environment and reduce air, water and waste pollution. I wish to perpetuate my energies to assisting America and her people accomplish these goals."

The Congressman, 58, and who is a native of Goldfield, Nevada, said he is noting with gratification the increased mining activity in Nevada and pledged he would continue to encourage even more re-activation of this basic Nevada industry.

He promised to stand by as the watchdog over the proper use of the public lands in Nevada for the benefit of ranching and recreation lands and sites through his long and valuable experience as Chairman of the House Interior Committee's Public Lands' Subcommittee.

Baring said he would also pursue his plans for more development of water resources in the State.

"I want to continue to protect the interests of the veterans of all foreign wars who live in Nevada and who have sacrificed so much for their country. My ranking

position on the House Veterans' Affairs Committee puts me in an advantageous position to do just that," said the 18-year Congressman.

Baring went from the domestic scene to the international situation and reaffirmed his stand that "if the American government is not going to pursue a military victory by pushing the communists out of South Vietnam, then U.S. forces should be withdrawn as rapidly as is safely possible without sacrificing any more men."

He added, "I have absolutely no tolerance for

continuing a 'no-win' war at the dreadful expense of our American boys' lives."

In regard to Cambodia, Baring said, "I feel the destruction of the sanctuaries in Cambodia was necessary, but this should have been accomplished five or six years ago. I am definitely opposed to extending another American supported Asian ground war in Cambodia."

Congressman Baring maintains a residence in Reno. He is married to the former Geraldine Buchanan and is the father of four sons, one who served recently in Vietnam.
