BONNER FOR DISTRICT JUDGE

John W. Bonner filed Tuesday for District Judge, Department 3. Bonner was elected and re-elected District Attorney of White Pine (Ely) County, Nevada. He served four years as Special Assistant Attorney General for the Colorado River Commission, handling all of the legal matters for the

Commission during that period.

He was appointed United States Attorney for the State of Nevada by President John F. Kennedy and served four years in that capacity. He resigned as United States Attorney to return to private practice in 1966.

He will campaign on the platform that with 32 years of very active legal practice in all state and federal courts of Nevada and several cases he has taken to the United States Supreme Court, he can serve the people efficiently effectively. He will continue his past practice of hard work while on the bench. He believes that with the increase of crime and of civil litigation, he can be of material help in carrying out the duties of District Judge.

He stands on his past record and invites the voters to check his record with attorneys and judges throughout the state.

WILSON FOR ASSEMBLY NO. 4

Assemblyman Woodrow Wilson filed for re-election to a third term in the State Assembly, District 4, on the Republican ticket.

During the 1969 session of the Legislature, Wilson was Chairman, Health and Welfare Committee; Vice Chairman, Labor Committee; member, Education Committee; and a member of the Legislative Commission's Social Welfare Study Subcommittee.

Wilson feels, "The next session of the Legislature will deal with greatest number of complex problems to confront the citizens of Nevada in the last several decades: reapportionment, crime, inflation, air pollution, inadequate funds for education, and the broad spectrum of social problems."

Wilson was one of 30 black elected official selected throughout the United States to attend a planning conference co-sponsored by the National Urban Coalition and the Metropolitan Allied Research Center, which met last month in Washington, D.C.

As the only Negro in the State Legislature, Wilson is asked to serve on many boards and commissions with local and statewide scope: Nevada State Commission on

Crime; delinquency and correction; Chairman, Nevada State Advisory Committee; U.S. Commission on Civil Rights; State Vocational Education Advisory Committee; and Advisory Council Southwest Regional Laboratory for Educational Research and Development.

Assemblyman and Mrs. Wilson reside at 625 Frederick Avenue, Las Vegas.

KACHULAS FOR CO. COMMISSION

Joe Kachulis, candidate for County Commission, is deeply disturbed over the continued contamination of the youth of this community by the use of narcotics. It is my personal opinion that the majority of the crime rate here is directly attributed to narcotics users, who must and will satisfy their habits to which they have become both physical and mental slaves. I promise to you, the people, that I will do my utmost to smash the suppliers of this deadly disease, which has infected 16,000 and up, of the youth in the country, said Kachulis.

Joe is against forced integration and forced busing. "I feel that this is a violation of our constitutional rights. If integration of our schools is to be accomplished peacefully, it must be done on a voluntary basis. I believe that any child should go to the school closest to his home."

HALL FOR SECY. OF STATE

Roger E. Hall, Director of the Las Vegas Valley Water Board, has filed as a candidate for Secretary of State on the Republican ticket.

Hall, 49, pledges the same policies that he has pursued during his terms as Director of the Water Board. His experience as a member of

the Board and with agencies of the Atomic Energy Commission at the Test Site and his present job as Chief Mechanical Engineer for the building and safety department for Clark County, has given him the administrative experience in governmental procedures which could be put to work for the State. Hall believes a younger man should be in the office, updating the department, with foresight in implementing more efficient policies and proper effective procedures.

He was elected to the Water Board in 1964 and has served on that Board continuously since then as Secretary-Treasurer and at present is Vice-President of the Board.

A resident of Las Vegas for 18 years, he and his wife, Billie, and their children reside at 2176 Pueblo Way.

BLAKE FOR STATE TREASURER

Dean Blake, 55, has filed with John Koontz for the office of State Treasurer. Blake says a fresh new look is required in the office. A new look at investment of idle funds in the demand checking account can assure the state's General Fund of many additional thousands of dollars per year. A new look at cooperation with the other financial departments of the executive branch will materially improve the accounting and record keeping of the state. These require attendance and attention to the requirements of Nevada Revised Statutes and coordinated effort with the Board of Finance, Comptroller and the Department of Administration Budget
