LONG RANGE RADAR THREATENS ISRAEL FRANCE BACKS LEBANON ALL THE WAY

GREECE TO FREE ARAB MURDERERS

JERUSALEM (WNS) — Israeli Foreign Minister Abba Eban has called on the Greek government not to honor its agreement to free Arab terrorists in return for the release of a hijacked Greek airliner with 55 persons aboard.

The Greek government agreed to release the seven terrorists in a month "when the Greek laws will have been observed and the sense of justice will have been fulfilled by putting two of the Arabs on trial," Deputy Premier Stylianos Patakos said. He explained in an official statement that the move

would be made "in accordance with standing Government practice."

Freeing of the seven terrorists, including two awaiting trial for manslaughter in connection with the death of a two-year-old Greek boy during an attack on the Athens office of El Al, would only encourage terrorist acts against airliners and airline offices, the Foreign Minister indicated. It was explained that guerrillas would feel confident that if they were captured, fellow terrorists would secure their release by holding jet planes and

passengers as hostages.

The other five terrorists included two serving a short prison term for an attack on an El Al plane in December, 1968 in which one Israeli passenger died and three other sentenced to light prison terms for trying to carry weapons and explosives aboard a plane a year later. The attack on the El Al office occurred last November, and the two terrorists were to be tried last week.

Six Arabs hijacked the Olympic Boeing 272 jet during a flight from Beirut to Athens. The plane continued to Greece and the terrorists radioed Greek officials that they would blow up the jet unless the captured Arabs

PARIS (WNS) — Lebanon has returned all the Mirage jet fighters supplied to the Arab state by France and instead will receive aircraft "more suitable" to its needs and operational ability.

A French newspaper, meanwhile, reported that French technicians have set up an ultra-modern radar station in Lebanon able to cover the entire eastern Mediterranean and as far south as the Sinai. The publication asserted that French technicians were manning the station and reporting on Suez Canal air battles. These technicians claim that "the Israelis minimize their losses by 12 percent, the Egyptians by 60 percent." The Lebanese have so far refused to divulge their radar-gathered information to other Arab nations, the

Open Letter to Nixon

Dear Mr. President:

There are so many things happening all over the world and in Nevada, and you are such a very busy man these days, what with throwing baseballs to catchers of both teams and into the stands, and it wasn't even opening day, it is possible you missed an item or two in the news.

There's a big mish mash going on over in the Mideast. If you are a headline reader, Mr. President, you'd think Israel was a low down, no gooder for not accepting the U.S. proposal for peace, which the Arabs, except the miserable no account guerrillas, latched on to in a hurry. The headlines screamed: "MIDEAST TO BECOME ANOTHER VIETNAM" and "ARABS ACCEPT U.S. PEACE PLAN, NOT ISRAEL." It's creating a picnic among lotsa people, especially those who are looking for any reason to rap the Jews.

You know, Mr. President, that was not the original intention of the proposals, but that's exactly what is happening. The U.S. proposal, in a simple, understandable effort to stop the hostilities, is a three month cease fire to be supervised by the United Nations. But the wise heads in Israel are not that naive. Day after day, for months now, the Israeli Air Force and cannon crews have been pounding away to prevent the Arabs from setting up the Russian Sam 2 and 3 gun emplacements along the Suez. What will happen during the 90-day cease fire, supervised no less, by the U.N.? With the U.N. nothing more than a Communist propaganda platform the Arab foothold will become established as sure as God made little apples.

Mr. President, do you know why the Russians are so anxious to establish the beachhead on the Suez? They want a

DAVID CANTER FOR SCHOOL BD.

Attorney David Canter, 33, has filed for election to the Clark County School Board.

Canter is a graduate of Northwestern University and received his Juris Doctor degree from Ohio State law school. He and his wife, Bonnie, have a daughter and are expecting a second child in September.

Long interested in education, Canter noted that "recently the school board built a wall in the auditorium where their public meetings are held to separate themselves from the people they represent. That wall symbolizes all that is wrong with our school system. The first thing I'll do is remove that wall and let the people back in where we belong."

Canter first became involved in education in 1966, while representing teachers before the school board. He has continued to work to strengthen teachers' legal rights under the Dodge Act and opposed the 1.7 to 1 teacher salary ratio.

Last year, Canter

represented four local parents who filed lawsuits reappportioning the state and local education boards, and who intervened in the school integration case to oppose forced bussing, while supporting voluntary integration.

During 1969, Canter demanded a grand jury investigation after the school board signed a \$1 million dollar book contract with the EMR publishing company, when it was revealed the company had offered money to 27 district employees. The same year Canter led a parents protest after the school board refused to transport children living within 3 miles of their neighborhood schools.

A member of the Clark County and Nevada state bar associations, Canter is active in many civic organizations, including the Elks, Toastmasters and Paradise Valley Improvement Association.

JACK HAMMES FOR COMMISSIONER

Jack Hammes has filed for election to the office of County Commissioner from the City of Las Vegas.

An elected Director of the Las Vegas Valley Water district, he serves as Secretary-Treasurer. He has spearheaded the Master Water Plan which has received high praise from all public and political entities.

A sixteen year resident of Las Vegas, he lives with his wife, "Babe" at 1621 San Pedro. He has one daughter, Hilary, a graduate sociologist. He has attended the Wharton School of Finance at the University of Pennsylvania and has studied Business Administration in Washington, D.C.

The family have been members of Temple Beth Shalom since moving to Las Vegas. As far back as 1955, Babe served as Sunday School teacher when the Temple was on Carson Street.

Jack Hammes is a member of the Regional Highway Planning Commission and recently received a national appointment to the National Service to Regional Councils.

Active in community and civic affairs, he is the Past President of the Nevada Rehabilitation Association and Past President of the Hotel Riviera Employees Foundation. He presently serves on the Child Welfare Board of the City of Las Vegas and is a Director in the Clark County Association for Mental Health, also on the Legislative and Membership Committee. He is a charter member of the American Society of Public Administrators and a member of the Greater Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce. He holds membership in the Fraternal Order of Police Associates, American Legion, the Optimists and is a member of the Clark County Democratic Central Committee.

Jack Hammes takes the common sense approach to government through Master Planning for today and the future. On the basis of intimate experience and education in this field, he states that "generation gaps, business trends and political variations can be well fitted into a planned system."
